Good morning. Good afternoon. Good evening. Wherever you are out there in the world, it's time to step out onto The HighWire. Well, if you've been watching this show for some time, you're getting really used to that sort of opening bumper that talks about the fact that you are our sponsors and nobody else, no Exxon, no diapers or vitamin companies, for that matter. But there's one little pesky side effect to the fact that you're our sponsors, and that is that sometimes you all get really, or not, but a group of you get really obsessed with a certain idea and you want us to cover it. Today is going to be one of those shows where we're going to dive into a space that is going to be uncomfortable for some and maybe just downright awful for others. But because it is rising in importance for many of you, we've decided we're going to go there. And what am I talking about? Well, it's been sort of recently triggered by the Grammy Awards in which Sam Smith, the singer, sang a song called Unholy. And, if it was already graphically, the images were not bothersome enough, perhaps this tweet really pushed it all over the edge when we realized that Sam Smith said this is going to be special hashtag Grammys. And CBS responded, You can say that again. We are ready to worship. To worship. I mean, you could have argued that this was just a lot of red and maybe some reflecting or looking at images that seem satanic. But when CBS says they're ready to worship, we're not the only ones that are freaked out. There's headlines about it.

CBS quietly deletes Grammy tweets saying, We are ready to worship satanic Sam Smith performance. Or maybe recently you were bothered by Jamie Lee Curtis' tweets. She was trying to point out that in her office, she's got these chairs that she guess I got from a movie set. Well, nobody seemed to care about the chairs, it was actually the picture of the naked child in a plastic bucket that bothered a lot of people. It was so bothersome that people ultimately she took it down. Here it is, Jamie Lee Curtis slammed for photo of naked child in a box, strong Epstein vibes. She ended up taking the tweet down. Now, there's a lot of reading into those stories and what's really happening there, I don't know for sure. But then there's the headlines that we do know exactly what's happening in their headlines like this. USF player among 213 arrested in Polk County human trafficking sting. I guess you probably have a sense of where this is going. And so, I'm going to give a warning, as I do sometimes, for those of you that use The HighWire as a class for your home school children, which I love, and we give a lot of great information. This is one of those shows that I am going to warn, you're probably best watching it yourself and deciding whether or not you think your kids are ready to watch or talk about these types of issues. In fact, I'm going to take it a step further. This may be one of those shows where some people are too sensitive to want to go there at all. In fact, while working on this episode, I had staff members who said, Del, I would rather not look through this footage and get into this.

It's just not spiritually where I want to be, and I totally understand that. So in order to have this conversation later in the show, I'm going to be sitting down and interviewing Sean Stone. He's the son of one of my favorite film directors in the world, Oliver Stone. Sean Stone has an illustrious film career of his own, and he's put out a documentary series called Best Kept Secret, where he dives into some of these very, very controversial and often dark subjects. I found that Sean Stone's work in this really relied on a lot of actual interviews that he's done throughout the last several years, and evidence and proof of things that I was not aware of. So I think it's a very interesting series for those that want to go there. But again, you may not want to even take in these type of subjects because somehow it unearths where you're at or how you want to see the world, and I totally understand that. So my warning is there, but it's a little bit later in the show. So for those of you that just want to keep it light for a little while and get into just some of the issues that aren't quite as dark, it's time for The Jaxen Report. All right, Jefferey. It's not like you don't do hard-hitting deep investigations that can be very disturbing, but what's coming up later is a little bit of a different animal. So what have you got for us today?

All right. Well, so a milestone event happened right at the end of 2022, and like a lot of major events in history, when they're happening, it's hard to see really the gravity of the situation we're looking at. So what am I talking about. Really, the advent of artificial intelligence and it being released onto the general public. And this was the headline, New York Times, The Tech That Will Invade Our Lives in 2023. And this was in December 2022, this was written. And we're talking about artificial intelligence technology in the form of assistants that are able to interact with us so we can interact with them. We can now use programs that will compose essays, write code, even make poems and art. And this is something that's happening right now, and it's been going on for several months. It's been released into the open, the free range, if you will, and it's being used by everybody. And this is really the first time that something like this has happened. There's been theoretical ideas. The WEF, World Economic Forum, talks about the fourth industrial revolution and we're going to merge with machines. And so this is really the first step into this. And before this moment, there's just been a lot of speculation. What would this look like? How would it change humanity? And we're in it now. But let's go back to 2013. We have the University of Oxford talking about the future of employment. This was really the first big conversation that was had while talking about artificial intelligence and robots.

And it says this. According to our estimates, around 47% of total US employment is in the high risk category. We refer to these jobs at-risk, i.e. jobs we expect could be automated relatively soon, perhaps over the next decade or two. So it was about job loss, talking about how these machines and this AI is going to replace replace people's jobs. But then, about a year after that, then some of the big warnings started to come in. You had Stephen Hawking, theoretical physicist, often referred to as one of the modern day geniuses. Here's the headline here. Stephen Hawking warns Artificial Intelligence could end mankind. So now we're getting some really chilling predictions here. Even Elon Musk. Now, this guy has been obviously a very controversial character because he's he's against AI, he's for AI, he's developing it, he's not. But 2014, this is what he's talking about. Here's the headline. Elon Musk: artificial intelligence is our biggest existential threat. So obviously, no one's beating around the bush here when when these when these heavy hitters are talking about this. But now 2017 comes around and we go from debating to actually looking at evidence. Now we have some solid evidence here. And this is this is the headline here. This is by the National Bureau of Economic Research. The robot debate is over, the jobs are gone and they aren't coming back. That's an op-ed talking about this. But the actual evidence here is this document here, evidence from US labor markets. So they started to look at the labor markets and the advent of these robots and this AI technology.

And it says this. Overall, our summary of the quantitative magnitudes implied by our analysis is that one more robot reduces employment in a commuting zone with the average exposure to robots by 6.2 workers, and one more robot per 1000 employees reduces wages in such a commuting zone by about 0.73%. So now we have some hard numbers. We have one robot or AI technology is replacing 6.2 workers. So, really, at that point, 2017, it's only sped up to the point where now we meet with the WEF's Fourth Industrial Revolution talking about just ending most jobs indefinitely. This goes for third world economies. They're going to get hit even harder than this. But then we get into the implementation or implanting of this technology into people. So, the merging with machines. This is the stuff Ray Kurzweil talks about. And this, again, here's Elon Musk. This is this controversial figure, he comes in, he has Neuralink technology, which is this technology that is sitting on your skull but also implanted into your brain and interacting with you. And here's the headline on that. I mean, many headlines, Brain implant thinner than hair, how a novel technology may allow people to use devices with their mind. And this rollout has been continually delayed by Neuralink. But, we have some research, there's people in research studies right now that are using these interfaces, these these brain interfaces with machines, or these body interfaces with machines.

And, we're getting some of the first feedback from this. And it's really it's really stunning stuff. So check out this headline here, we start to talk about it. It became me. Studies show that revolutionary new brain chips may bend your mind in strange and troubling ways, and it talks about the Frederic Gilbert. He's a philosopher, professor of applied neuro-ethics. This is a new place of study, I guess, you want to talk about it. He says, Gilbert told me about one patient he had interviewed who developed a kind of decision paralysis, eventually feeling as if they couldn't go out or decide what to eat without first consulting the device that showed what was going on in their brain. There's nothing wrong with having a device that is completing a decision, Gilbert said, but at the end, the device was kind of supplanting the person in the decision, kicking them out of the loop. So, it goes on to say this. Another patient he talks about, it says sometimes a patient can come to rely so much on their device that they can feel like they can't function without it. Gilbert has encountered many study participants who have fallen into depression upon losing support for their devices and having them removed, often simply because a given trial expired or ran out of funding. You grow gradually into it and get used to it, an anonymous study participant who had received a device to detect signs of athletic activity, said in an interview. It became me.

It's not hard for me to even imagine that when I think about my cell phone. In fact, my wife accidentally left her cell phone the other night at an event we were at, and that whole half a day for her was disconcerting, for me was disconcerting. We are at a point where you can't live without that technology. Now, it's not being neuro-webbed into our brain yet, but you get a sense of how important this is outside of your body. What happens if it's wired into your brain? And when you bring up this topic with Elon Musk, one of the things I keep thinking about is the interview that I did with Alex Jones, where he puts something, I don't know whether it's true or not necessarily, but what he said has stuck with me, and he said that Elon Musk is really sort of, represents the Illuminati, I guess, if you will, and that the Illuminati are against AI, but their way of beating AI is to sort of implant these devices into yourself so you can compete with AI. And I wonder if that's really where Elon Musk is at. It's sort of, the theory by Alex Jones that Elon Musk doesn't believe we can survive. I think he's right there with other scientists that we've discussed, that think that this is the end of the world. So for some, it's like the only way we're going to compete is we're going to have to be part computer too. All really horrifying thoughts no matter how you slice it.

Yeah, absolutely. And one of the reasons I wanted to cover this conversation as well is I hear a lot of people, being a writer, being a journalist, that people are using this technology to write essays, to write articles, to write, and even even the Financial Times, other other publications are starting to use this in their reporting. So we hear people saying, this is great, this is really helpful for people. But, as a society, we should have a strong society to build this network out from. And coming from the COVID response, we have we have a lot of issues in our society and we're kind of just falling into, we're forced to fall into this AI technology to support us, because a lot of places in society are falling apart, so to speak, with the job market and things like that. So, that's a concerning thing for my for from my perspective. But also, there's a thing called OpenAI. So this is an umbrella, I guess, company, if you want to call it. And they have some of these, they have some of these programs. One of them is ChatGPT. And this is a program you can interface with this AI directly and just ask it any question you want and it'll write back the conversation. So, I thought I'd do a little test with it. And what I did was I asked it to write a thousand-word essay in your voice, in the voice of Del Bigtree.

On the similarities between the COVID-19 vaccine science and the science supporting the childhood vaccination schedule. And so this is what it said. The childhood vaccination schedule is based, and again, this is, in your words, the childhood vaccination schedule is based on decades of scientific research. Scientists have studied these vaccines and thousands of clinical trials, and they have conducted countless studies to make sure that these vaccines are safe and effective. The science behind the COVID-19 vaccine is no different. I should say, you go on to say, Del, your AI person goes on to say, the COVID-19 vaccines were developed using the same rigorous scientific process as any other vaccine. The vaccines were also subjected to the same regulatory process as any other vaccine. The FDA carefully reviewed the data from the clinical trials, and they only authorized the vaccines for emergency use after they demonstrated that they were safe and effective. Oh, man. And wait for this one. It goes on to say, the AI says, The truth is, the COVID-19 vaccines have been shown to be safe and effective and the clinical trials involving tens of thousands of participants. Yes, there may have been some reports of side effects, but these are rare and generally mild. And yes, there is still some uncertainty about how long the protection from the vaccines will last. But the evidence we have so far suggests that the vaccines provide strong and durable protection against COVID-19 vaccines. Del, you're AI...

It looks like I only like leaked into the end there. Some part of me is like, and there are some questions out there. Not a very good job of representing my perspective at all. And though, the part of it I would parse out is, it is true that the trials for COVID vaccine are just like the trials for the childhood vaccines, almost nonexistent and totally unreliable, would have been the adjectives that I would have used. But, when you look at this technology, and I've been at seminars where they're talking about what you can use it for your network, and the work that you're doing and probably get rid of some extra costs on people that are writing it. Maybe I could get rid of you Jefferey and we'll just have some AI writing The Jaxen Report. But I think what's even more alarming is what about kids. And what about kids coming up through school? I mean, and first of all, teachers are busy. I mean, you've always had kids that, like, steal each other's work or sometimes even pay a kid to do their work. But you've got a computer out there that will write a dissertation, on however many words are required, and be relatively accurate, especially how the computers are, where the what your teacher would think is the truth. I don't even understand, how is a kid getting an education? It seems like it'd be so easy to cheat with this, with this...

That has been a concern as well, absolutely. And reading those answers that the AI generated in your voice, it really reminds me of watching the the legacy media, the CNNs the ABCs. These are the same talking points continually by the Fauci's and the Rochelle Walensky's. Durable protection, safe and effective, rare, mild, I mean, the same buzz words. It's almost like, who's programing this. And so, now we move on to the the other aspect of this, the flip side of this AI, and this is the censorship piece. So people in organizations have been using this this artificial intelligence to develop censorship paradigms. And we really have been targeted by those. So this was the FTC, the Federal Trade Commission, in 2022, and they put out a warning. They put out a report, this is a consumer protection agency, report warns about using artificial intelligence to combat online problems. And again, this is the misinformation, agency concerned with AI harm, such as inaccuracy, bias, discrimination and commercial surveillance creep. And so we really started to see this, Del, by Google in 2019. And one of our previous guests, Zach Voorhies, he let out something called the Machine Fairness, Machine Learning Fairness, MLF. And he leaked some documents, and we looked at those documents at that time in 2019, and we noticed that this Google manipulation was swaying vaccine legislation at the time.

This was the headline that we wrote then. Did Google's manipulation sway vaccine legislation? And in it, we have this. A leaked internal Google email describes its goal to establish a single point of truth for definition of quote, news, across Google products. That's their search engine. So there can't be nuanced debate, just one answer. And now it goes on to say this. Another leaked document describes how Google, Google's product, known as MLF, that's Machine Learning Fairness, operates by explaining, in some cases, it may be appropriate to take no actions if the system accurately reflects current reality, while in other cases it may be desirable to to consider how we might help society reach a more, an equitable state via product intervention or broader corporate social responsibility.

So you really, you really start to read that, you have this machine learning, and these are inputs by people into the AI. So you have artificial intelligence, but you have this machine learning, where it learns to be socially responsible, to help society. And so, you can read between the lines on that, when it comes to vaccination, if there's any any issues around the vaccination, those are not going to be incorporated in this machine learning, as we saw with with the chat bot AI when we were looking at you writing that a thousand word essay.

So, now it's kind of come out since 2019 that this machine learning fairness, this is a headline here, Machine learning fairness, a globalist funded effort to control AI. So it's really, really out in the open now what this really is, and so one of the think tanks, one of the, I guess, major censorship industries or corporations is NewsGuard, someone that's really been on the tail of HighWire for for a long time, and writing, fact-checking, they're supposed to be an independent fact-checking network, fact-checking company, and they've been used to to come after us. And this is their website here, Tracking disinformation campaigns with human intelligence and AI. So you look at their website, AI is all over there. That's their main kind of product line, if you will, they use to to do this censorship. And so, we look back and we see in 2020, again, they're supposed to be independent fact-checkers and they're using this AI technology. They had a jump-start on it, in fact. In 2020, we have NewsGuard wins Pentagon-State Department contest for detecting COVID-19 misinformation and disinformation. So, right there we have Pentagon funding, but just a year later, they must have been doing so well, and they were so independent, that in 2021, September, we have the Department of Defense awarding them this contract. \$749,387, NewsGuard Technologies, DOD, September 2021.

And so that is basically the military branch of the American government funding an independent news-checking agency to censor online conversations and directly targeting us. And it's not stopping there. So again, these AI technologies are being branched out and, I guess, weaponized against the American people. We have the State Department funded a foreign think tank working to censor Americans. So this is the Institute for Strategic Dialog. They work with YouTube, Spotify, to help with their moderation decisions. And it says here, the State Department awarded the organization a grant that's a \$250,000 grant, in September, again, September of 2021, to, quote, advance the development of promising and innovative technologies against disinformation and propaganda in Europe and the UK after it won the US Paris Tech challenge. So, Del, the government can't get around the First Amendment restrictions by by outsourcing this stuff to, outsourcing to these companies to limit the speech for the for the US government. So that's a big problem and this is something we're hoping to see Congress actually move on because the evidence is here in spades. And last week, Senator Ron Johnson brought this up in a Homeland Security briefing in front of Congress. And this is what it looked like.

He starts his testimony talking about the large language models, for example, like ChatGPT. He says, advanced large language models such as ChatGPT have burst onto the scene with a vengeance in the last six months. ChatGPT recently completed this SAT and scored 1020. A score of 1020 is equivalent to an IQ of about 110, which makes ChatGPT more intelligent than 75% of people. The significance of all this should not be underestimated. We now have AI systems capable of engaging in genuine conversation, able to write, able to produce computer code, able to quote, think, and they'll much they'll be much smarter very soon. He goes on to talk about the rights of given to the extended digital self. He writes, For centuries we were all simple enough so that our names sufficed to identify us. Online, however, things are very different. Our digital identity is composed of the tools we use, the apps, programs, services, websites, etcetera, that we choose voluntarily to employ, as well as the records of our virtual behavior, our browsing patterns, our purchases, our records of travel. The written communications and images we issue on platforms such as Instagram, Facebook, and more ominously, TikTok, which essentially operates under the control of the Chinese Communist Party. That extended digital self has very few rights, and our legal structure has not been able to adapt itself to the immense changes on the virtual front. The logical extension of such danger, and most likely outcome, in his estimation, is the duplication in the West of something approximating the utter catastrophe of the so-called social credit system in China. Everything is tracked and controlled. The government can, with the stroke of a pen, seize the economic resources of any given individual or group.

And in parentheses, he says something that happened very ominously in Canada in the case of the truckers convoy. He goes on, developing AI capabilities will radically extend the surveillance state. China has about 400 cameras watching every 1000 people. We could well be entering an era of authoritarian AI-mediated social shunning. The use of such cameras should be banned. Machines should never be given the authority to ticket, try, punish, or limit the economic or practical activities of human beings. He goes on, talks about additional dangers. In the next year, AI wizards will produce intelligence systems that will be able to produce representations of any person doing anything that can be described. The so-called deep fakes. Imagine those being released on the eve of a critical election. Then imagine that happening everywhere, on every issue, thousands of times. Imagine being entirely unable to determine, day to day, what communication from what person, photos, videos, audio recordings, writings, is real, and what is false. Then imagine that now. Not in some distant future. That's where we're at. Steps must be taken on the legal front to make false digital representations of living persons not only illegal, but seriously illegal. He concludes, The development of AI systems as intelligent as we are, and I would add, probably even more so, is not some future possibility, but a current actuality. The melding of AI-mediated intelligence systems with our capacity for monitoring and surveillance prepares the way for a tyranny so comprehensive that we can barely imagine it. Now, again, these are just excerpts from his testimony, and I wish Dr. Peterson could have been here remotely to offer that.

It's good to see Ron Johnson getting these concerns on the record. But as far as the NewsGuard story, as soon as we saw this, I reached out to Aaron Siri, our lawyer, to ask, do we have a lawsuit here? Because NewsGuard wastes a considerable amount of my time asking me fairly irrelevant questions based in their bias and lack of scientific information challenging the things that we've stated here, and I've talked about it before. I have said to NewsGuard time and time again, No, you were wrong about lab origin, you've been wrong about the effectiveness of the vaccine. We've been right on all those things. We like how our news is aging over time. How do you feel about the fact that yours isn't aging well at all, and you are the arbiters, apparently, of truth? I never get a response to questions like that, unfortunately.

Exactly. And it would be interesting if they were just another news agency in the open market, they wouldn't last very long because they seem to be wrong a lot. So there's been some tectonic changes in the vaccine conversation since COVID happened. And there's been a lot of conversation about the the vaccination, the childhood vaccination schedule, parents kind of stepping back from that, but also the legislation aspect. People are getting involved, states are getting involved and representatives are getting involved. And in Maryland, there's been a really big win here. We covered this at breaking at The HighWire. This was the headline, if you want to check it out. Legislative victory for parental rights in Maryland as politicians now take the offensive. So, there was a bill by Cheryl Kagan, she's a senator in Maryland, and she put forward a bill talking, basically giving minors of at least 14 years or older the same capacity of adults to consent to vaccination. And what happened at that point was there was a, there was a legislative voting hearing coming up, and the activist group in Maryland said, if you go forward with this, we're going to bring in so many experts, it's going to make your head spin. And there's going to be sound bites all over the internet of these experts just destroying your conversation here, because now the COVID vaccine is in this conversation.

So now you're going to have, hypothetically, kids, minors consenting to a COVID vaccination, experimental vaccine, big problems there. So, Senator Kagan withdrew before this hearing, she withdrew the bill, and this is her letter here. And she says that she just basically wants this completely gone. Withdraw the bill, there was a very weak reasoning why she did it, she basically said we didn't have the time or staff to really make this bill how we wanted it. And, and again, this bill would have included kids with with developmental disabilities. So this is what we're talking about here. But what's interesting is not only did the bill withdraw, but we have another senator, Justin Ready, he put forward a bill in that same month to kind of force this issue, SB 566. This would establish the fundamental right of parents to direct the upbringing of their children. That includes the health of their children, and it also would prohibit governments from infringing on these parental rights. So we have we have kind of a a strengthening of the rights in the face of this bill being withdrawn, which is really great news to see, see the offensive and not just always this defense.

Absolutely. I mean, and it really sort of makes you wonder, where are these bills going, right? And we've obviously we've talked about we've talked about the Maryland bill and I'm glad they've had success there. We won, obviously in Washington, DC. We brought the case against the same minor consent for vaccination bill in Washington, DC, and we won that case. And California tried to bring it and we let them know, we sent a letter to all the legislators that you will be breaking the law and we will bring the same case to Los Angeles, I mean, to California. And we are prepared to do that all across the country. But people need to be aware that this is this is prime territory, that the pro-vaxxers, and really the pharmaceutically-dependent humans on this planet, they really are pushing for this. That children get to override their parents and secretly go off and make a commitment to vaccines without their parents there. It's really, really scary stuff and totally destroys the family.

Absolutely. And that and that Washington, DC bill you mentioned, that was put forward before the COVID pandemic response and was killed during the response in 2022. Here's the headline up at The HighWire when we reported on that. Lawsuit halts law allowing doctors to vaccinate 11-year-olds without parental consent. That was an ICAN-funded lawsuit that did that. And, where did this all come from? Really, in 2019. Again, right before that pandemic started, we saw a surge in these this this push to eliminate what they call the parent barrier from decision making when it comes to the medical community. And this was the American Medical Association in 2019. This was from their annual meeting. AMA adopts new policies on first day of voting at 2019 annual meeting. So you think, okay, the American Medical Association probably doesn't support this, does it? Well, actually, this is what it says. AMA supports mature minors ability to consent to vaccination. The AMA will support state policies allowing minors to override their parent's refusal for vaccinations. Under the new policy adopted by the nation's physicians, the AMA will encourage state legislators to establish comprehensive vaccine and minor consent policies. So those are big words. That's really war on the family. And you can see this now. These are other states that are starting to bring this. So Maryland has has kind of backed off, but we have New Jersey. This is A-2679, this permits minors aged 14 years or older to consent to certain vaccines without permission of a parent or guardian. In New York, we have a little bit of a different flavor to this. We have a bill that allows minors to be vaccinated for STDs without parental consent or knowledge.

So they're talking about obviously Gardasil vaccine, a very, very dangerous vaccine that's been problematic for so many innocent teenagers and adults across the country.

Yes, it is. Yes, it is. And so, as I was looking at this and watching this thing happen, and it reminded me of 2017. And 2017 was really the big push. This was an article I wrote at the time. I noticed there was about 134 bills that were pushed forward, bills of all sorts, trying to eliminate the barriers between a vaccination and a child's arm, whether it be a parent, a religious exemption, a philosophical exemption. It just full force went forward. And so, what I saw there I'm seeing again, but with a little bit of a different space in the medical community. And it's right in the mainstream headlines now, and this is it right here. Transgender youth care targeted in cultural battles sweeping US. And here is the headline, here is the quote. Sounds familiar. The wave of nearly 100 bills reflects the political and cultural chasm over gender-affirming treatments for children, which conservative lawmakers view as potentially harmful, but transgender advocates say are essential to their mental and physical well being. And similarly to the vaccine conversation, it was allowed to move forward, the trying to divorce the children from the parents and this vaccine in the vaccine space. And now this has expanded outward because it never really was stopped.

Well they've gone as far as to say that if you do not sort of embrace this transgender space with your child and and make it available, these types of life-altering drugs, that somehow, it's been floated that that's equal to child abuse. I would argue almost the opposite side of that, that removing a child going through puberty and changing their hormonal structure for life could be deemed child abuse. But there really is a chasm now and a battle going on inside this country. And unfortunately, it's happening right as you're pointing out, in school system, in places where as we as parents aren't there to be a part of the conversation that's happening.

Exactly. And it's very similar to vaccine conversation in that parents actually don't have a right to know in many cases. So that's what is concerning. And one of the things that the Association of American Physicians and Surgeons has really put out a statement on this and this is what it is right here, if anyone wants to read this. AAPS statement on gender-affirming care for minor children, and it says here, conflicting motivations have led to a growing industry dedicated to providing gender-affirming procedures that are generally irreversible and have a high probability of causing sterilization. These include puberty blockers, sex hormones, and surgeries such as castration, penectomy and mastectomy. They commit a patient to a lifelong need for medical, surgical, and psychological care. AAPS goes on to say this, gender-affirming care in minors is medically and ethically contraindicated because of a lack of informed consent. There is some crossover language. There are inherently unknown and unknowable long term risks, and the consequences of removing normal healthy organs are irreversible. So this is the conversation going on right now, almost parallel to the vaccine, parents being out of the vaccine conversation. Although, the difference is the the vaccine conversation is actually getting on the offensive. So here's some good news, more good news, I should say, and you're seeing a lot of states with bills moving forward to be on the offensive on this.

So let's look at just a couple of them here. Arizona, this is a bill, it's prohibiting a person in loco parentis, basically meaning in place of the parent, from being able to consent to vaccination of a child. We have Iowa prohibits minors from being able to consent to vaccines for sexually transmitted diseases on the federal vaccine injury table. And you can see all the language is a little different. New Hampshire bill establishes a parental bill of rights, which includes the right of a parent to exempt his or her minor child from immunizations. Huge one there. Another New Hampshire bill requires parental guardian presence for minor vaccination during school vaccination clinics and restricts hours of school vaccination clinics. And finally, in Oregon, which is a state where you usually don't see this type of language, this is another one. Requires parental consent and review of medical records before a vaccine can be administered to a minor. So that's one of the big conversations is a minor child won't know their history, their contraindications to the vaccine. And if they can actually get this vaccine and be safe and they expect a doctor to know that, or at least just the child to give this a green light, a-okay. And then, the parents will have no idea what's going on.

Yeah. And when you think about it, for the last several years or something, it's almost like a reversal of this idea that a doctor shouldn't be in a room alone examining your child. Parents are now supposed to be there or someone that they trust, because we've had so many strange occurrences, some of which will probably be talking about with Sean Stone in a in just a minute coming up here. But in the end, we're we're talking about the safety measures that parents have always been there to protect their children. This idea that the parent is not only there to protect the child, but should be kept away in order to protect the child, now where does that end? That doesn't end with vaccines. And I think that a lot of these politicians do have some insight and are starting to pass laws around this because, look, whether it's do you want your child being forcibly put on or placed on some psychotropic drug. Oh, Susie seemed depressed and we didn't she didn't want to talk to her parents about it. She was embarrassed about it or, for whatever reason, and so the school just put them on psychotropic drugs. God forbid they have some side effect, you don't know what's going on, why is my child acting differently, no one's telling you anything. Forget about if your child has an anaphylactic reaction or starts, their heart swells because they got a vaccine and you're being asked, the hospital, I know they passed out, I don't know what happened.

But they'll say, well, did they have any drugs or anything recently? No, none at all. I mean, these are the problems. And then we talk about getting into these castration drugs, which is what some of these are. I mean, they're removing your ability to mature properly as an adult. Can imagine, somebody castrates your child without you knowing about it, because it was a teacher, child private conversation that the parents are left out of. I mean, we got to get on top of this. I think that parental rights measures are important all across the country, and I support anything and any legislator that wants to sort of get back to returning power to the parents. Really scary stuff, Jefferey. But things that we have to keep our eye on, we cannot keep our hand on our head in the sand on these issues. So thank you for bringing all that to our attention.

All of that is coming out of this work that we're doing here at The HighWire and through our non-profit, the Informed Consent Action Network. I got to tell you, there is a tidal wave of terrible bills and legislative ideas being brought to every politician through the pharmaceutical lobby, which is the most powerful lobby in Washington after COVID and the pandemic. I think you could argue it's the most powerful lobby in the entire world, and it seeks to control us and inject us and take our kids away and do whatever it wants to glorify itself, to play God and ultimately make trillions of dollars which will help it buy even more control of our lives. If you find that nerve-racking at all, there's one thing you can do to push back the tide that's upon us, and that is be a supporter of The HighWire.

I'm going to start, I've probably put out a warning on this conversation today and this show more than I have on almost anything else I've covered. And I'm going to be honest with you, the topics that you cover and some in this series are ones that I say that I avoid them, I think, to sort of protect my own consciousness in a way. We met for dinner to talk about doing this, and I said to you, I don't like to get into topics that I feel like I don't have the time to do something about, right? But before we even start, for my audience, and I'm warning my audience right now, once again, this conversation, I do not believe, is one that your children should be involved in. I know so many of you use The HighWire to be class time, which I love that for your home schooling. I think this one you should watch first and decide whether or not this is a conversation you want to be having with your kids.

But how do we, before we even get into the topics, how do we how do you prepare yourself to get into a topic that has dark thoughts and energy around it, do you feel like you have to protect yourself?

You know, I've loved horror since I was in the womb. I think my mother was reading Stephen King when I was in the womb, and it sent, energetically, fear and that adrenaline into me. And I've loved horror since I was three, four years old. It was like, I begged her to to take me to see Pet Cemetery. And even though it terrified me, and even though these movies scared me as a kid, Nightmare on Elm Street, I loved. Candyman. It's like there was a fascination with how dark, how dark are things, really. I've always wanted to know that. I've always, in a sense, wanted to put myself energetically in that place of, okay, if we can just reveal the horror, then we can get past it. It's, it's the fear in between that's the problem, right? And we all know when you're sitting there and you don't know what's in the darkness, you're more scared. You're more in a fight or flight state, but you're not actually able to to activate it until you until you face it. And then you find out what you're made of. Am I going to fight this thing? Am I going to light up and reveal it, or am I going to run? Right? You have to actually get to that moment of seeing what you're afraid of. And too often we just we live in states of perpetual fear, in America, especially, I think. In many other countries, I've traveled the world with my father. I've been to places that are war zones or just after the war, and you get you get a realization of the existential crises that are faced all over the world daily, on a daily basis.

And yes, it happens here, too. Obviously, we do have starvation, we do have horrible things here. But essentially as a country, we've become a culture of, as we know, consumerism, consuming the television, the media, and they want us in a constant state of... When I was four years old, Saddam Hussein is going to destroy America. He's going to attack us with his rockets, right? He's going to launch rockets, and they could they could hurt us. Or then it became, you name it, it was, 9/11 was a big one. This was terrorism. Anywhere in the 2000-tens, it was like, anywhere you go, there could be a terrorist. You have to go through the airport with your hands up like a victim and constant states of fear that they are pushing. We saw it very clearly in 2020, right? But we've all seen this consistently, the pandemics, whether it was the bird flu or the swine flu or the HIV or the, you name it, the measles, everything. They want us in fear. And it's like, that's just not the way I am. I'm just someone that's like, okay, if I'm afraid of something, let's address it. Let's look at it. Let's find out what it is, so that we can be real. And then, there's no more fear on the other side, once you faced it, once you've addressed it.

When you were putting together this series, was there. Because, you cover a lot of, obviously, you cover a lot of ground, right? It's not all just, you have human trafficking issues. You have even some of this sacrifice issue. But you get into banking, you get into political controls, international, WEF stuff. So, was there a parameter to which, because you weave it, I have to say, you weave it together beautifully so that it all seems to hold together. How do you go about approaching a project like this?

It was a theme that I wanted to convey, and it was interesting timing. Synchronistically I was tuning in to this right at the beginning of the plandemic in March of 2020, they were locking people down. It was like, okay, nothing's going to happen for a minute, right? We're not going be able to go make movies. Maybe it's time for a documentary. And I was starting to think on my career and doing Buzzsaw, which was a pretty successful show on YouTube, had a lot of great interviews, great conversations. It got taken to Gaia for a few years, and I thought, Well, I've got all those Buzzsaw interviews, which were really cool. And we had we covered a whole gamut of topics, but what's the theme? The theme was, to me, making people understand, or not making them, helping them to understand, that there is a, a multi-dimensional experience of enslavement that is taking place in human consciousness. We are basically debt slaves. We are, some people are physically enslaved. We are mentally enslaved. We are, perhaps, energetically enslaved. How do we get through that? By recognizing the controllers, by recognizing those beings, some are, some some are people, and I believe some are beings, energetic entities, whatever you want to describe them as, that are essentially controlling the nature of our reality, and within this matrix, right? And our potential experience of it. So if we're going to actually experience a more vibrant, a more, a richer, a more exciting, hopefully vibrant and holistic reality on the other side of it, we've got to recognize what's holding us back.

So to me, it's like, it organically came from that theme. Going through these interviews that I've done with these people over the years, and whether it was Professor Griff from Public Enemy or David Icke or the new interviews with Cathy O'Brien and others, there's so many in this in this film that you'll see pulled together. It was just creating an overall tapestry of the control, the control apparatus.

Right, so that we can ultimately, on the other side of it, say I'm a more, how do you say, I am becoming sovereign over my mind, my body and my spirit, where before I was being led by this cult. Because as you're describing, what is it? It's ultimately, it's a cult.

And whether they're all in cahoots or not, it's like, there's a fundamental psychology of a cult, whether it's the Catholic Church or the Muslim Brotherhood or the CDC or, the government, the president, all these cults of power. We have to go give our energy to, we have to go bow down to, as opposed to saying, no, the only power really is in the creator itself and your relationship to that to your creator.

That gives you spirit, that that brings you here to this moment, by the grace of something much greater than any scientist can explain to you or any doctor can explain to you. So why should they be in the way of you and your relationship to your creator?

I agree. That's one of the sort of messages I've really been, as I've been speaking out more. I mean, obviously all through the pandemic, before that, this vaccine space that I'm in. But I've really been focusing lately on how do they get away with this? How many of us, I mean, I know we like to say, oh, they're evil or the evil being done to us, but I've been pointing out, if you didn't have the conversation with your brother or your sister, your mom, your dad, somebody at the dinner table, that you probably should have had warning them what you knew about this vaccine, because you didn't want to ruffle anyone's feathers. You didn't want to just make anyone have a bad day. In the end, it's that, it's that slippery slope of of number one, sort of compromising what you believe in. But also, we're we're stuffing, we're enslaving ourselves, right? That our need to be accepted in a conversation is an enslavement. It's keeping me from being who I am. And ultimately, I think it's a good point, I say we're you're walking dead. If you are walking down the road, if you are in conversations where you're not able to actually say and be who you are, then you're not really alive anymore. You are, we talk about like zombies, the zombie apocalypse, that's the zombie apocalypse. A bunch of people walking around that don't have a voice.

But what we find, and I think a lot of us have experienced this, what we find is that our freedom threatens others.

Because when you're, people's belief systems are the prison. They're prisons. They live within that, or prison, actually, too, is their perception, right? It's like that's their reality and it's oftentimes a prison for them. So when they're mentally in a prison state and they see you walking around living the life that you want to live, speaking the truth that you want to speak, they are they hate you for it. They are offended by it. So it's very difficult, I find, to oftentimes speak these way, speak these truths to people who are not ready to receive it. It's almost goes back to like Christ saying don't, giving giving jewels to swine. It's not to say like, I hate to be offensive, but like when people are not in the state to actually receive it as a human, I can't have a conversation with you, I always say this. I'm not going to debate someone who's not open-minded. All I want to know is, is this person actually curious and open? And if you're actually curious, then we can have a conversation, because I'm ready to learn things and you're ready to learn things, and we can learn from each other.

But if you're shut down, if you think there's nothing I'm going to say that's going to crack you. The only thing I can maybe do is we can we can find common ground in certain things, and maybe then you start to relax and then, you have to have your own experience. This is what I've experienced in the last 20 years of doing conspiracy work is like, people, everyone has their moment of revelation, where they go, The hospital killed my mother. Or, you name it, or the vaccine harmed my child. It's like, I'm sorry, but that's what it took. It didn't take my words or your words or anyone else who's been out there talking about it, didn't take their words. It took your direct experience.

Our mission is to educate the public, in this country and abroad, that this is happening. It's happening everywhere. That there are over 27 million children, women and children and men that are in slavery today. But in within the United States, there are 200,000 children that ended up in the sex trade every year. So, it's the fastest-growing criminal industry in the world, but it's organized crime. And that's the scary part, because it's organized crime, it does work with government. There's a lot of money in this. It's over a \$34 billion industry worldwide, and that number is actually low. If you ask the Department of Justice, they would ask tell you it's 84 billion, if you add in pornography and everything that children are taken and used for. So, it's a business. To get it into drug trafficking, you need cash. Get into child trafficking, you only need a child.

I mean, this is an issue that we know is happening. Here in Texas, it's such a major deal. We've got a border where a lot of this thing is moving back and forth. And yet, when you talked about like the government uses all these things to make us afraid, like all these things to put fear upon us. Here's something that's really happening and we almost get no coverage on it whatsoever. Why do you think that is?

It's interesting, I was actually just on a flight and they have the NFL now, you know, doing awareness around the human trafficking. They have like Aaron Rodgers and some others giving little talks about it, just saying, hey, this is going on, there is trafficking. There, it has been an increased awareness, like, that's the positive, right? As far as when I was first learning about these things in like the, like early 2000s, I would say, I was becoming aware of this because I was looking at the Franklin Scandal, which was in Nebraska. I'm not sure if you've heard of it, but it's a very famous case involving trafficking and rape of children and allegedly murder. But it was connected to the the Franklin Credit Union, which collapsed. And in that process, these things were exposed, but it was immediately silenced. The guy that was overseeing the investigation, his plane crashed with all you know, with all his documentation. And then it was his case was picked up by this guy, John DeCamp, who was pretty close with William Colby, the former CIA director. And the CIA director was like, listen, be careful. This is a level, when you get into two children, right? This is a level that, as you know, just destroys people. I mean, Epstein is dead as a result of this, right? You can't expose the relationships because it's so heinous, as far as the the public consciousness, right? So if it's simply unnamed, those drug lords or whatever, it's like if it's unnamed and distant, but the more it starts to become focused as far as politicians, potentially celebrities, right?

Anyone of renown that's involved in this, there would be such ,they understand that there is an impulse within, especially the American people, but globally, any any society that's that's human, is going to have a response to this. Now, it's true, there are some societies where the trafficking is done by families. You know, if you look at where a lot of this originates, it's parents selling their own children into these things, right, for money, because they're in debt slavery, and so they're in such horrible situations that they basically say, listen, buy my daughter for however much, or buy my son for much.

But in America, and the West in particular, but especially America, when people realize this is going on, we've seen it. I mean, how much of the conspiracy culture has shifted just in the last three years?

Now, what you find, and like I've done another interview with a CPS, someone who exposes the CPS, she's talking about how the CPS is oftentimes in bed....

Child Protective Services is very much in bed with some of these traffickers, and many of the kids that come out of foster homes end up disappearing.

But the point is that there is often times a monetary gain for people, for the CPS to grab the kids, take them, take them or protect the people that are foster parents who are getting money from, getting checks from the state, no matter how horrible.

But, is it systemic? Is that what CPS is doing? Or are people that are into this space drawn to this as a perfect place? If I can get in there and work there, I can start using this environment to come in contact with vulnerable children.

I'm not saying that CPS people are pedophiles. What I'm suggesting is that the apparatus of CPS is being used the same way that other government agencies are being used for corrupt purposes.

It's like, it's how can how can they be doing it? Number one, because you can't really fully prove that the parents were great parents or why this is happening. But I did get stories where it was systemic, like where you would see a systemic issue coming through a certain department. And I always think about, you know, you talk about doctors, it's true, they, I think they go into these jobs for good reasons. But I've always wanted to make a documentary about Child Protective Services. It is so vile and so evil what happens to so many families. Not all of them. It's not all bad, but what I always think is, it's like, you know, I imagine you start working for Child Protective Services, you get your first child that's being tortured or burned or chained to a bed or something like that. It must so mess up your mind where in that state you're fighting to try and get the courts to understand that this family, and I think these people develop like a hatred of family and parents and start seeing that everything is that case over and over again in their minds. They lose perspective.

I haven't studied enough in this. Again, I've done interviews on it and I've watched recently these little ones. It's very interesting. What you end up with is protocols. So, he focused on one case where basically parents called about their their kid having, it was like a six-month old, having some kind of symptoms, right, and calling the doctor. Immediately, protocols are put into place that say, well, this could indicate a child abuse situation.

And what happens, when I say the CPS people are not honestly protecting, because I've heard too many stories of foster parents who are literally, have eight kids sleeping in the backyard and being abused, but no one bothers them because, again, maybe there's a kickback situation with with the CPS agent. I don't know, I'm not going to speculate. But I just know that these things are happening. So we have a corrupt system. And as you know, when you have a corrupt system that is basically is enabling trafficking because for the purposes of money-making, again, at the highest levels, when you have people protecting the Epsteins of the world or in bed with literally in bed with the Epsteins of the world, who do you trust? You can only go to yourself. And this is where we have, this going back to my, always my theme, is like coming back to yourself, your own intuition, right? And getting away from this whole legal entanglement that we are all within, right? We are all, we don't know our, the codes, all the UCC codes that they that they operate under, the IRS codes and all these things, it's like it's a crazy web of power that is being created.

Well, speaking of that web of power, this next clip is really getting into, you'd have to be under a rock to not be watching this Epstein story and how it's all played out, but take a look at this.

One of the alleged procurers, her name is Ghislaine Maxwell, she procured underage girls for Epstein. And she is friendly, friendly enough where she was invited to Chelsea Clinton's wedding. Another enormous red flag was raised by the number of politicians that Epstein donated. Epstein is a very generous donor. He's a very generous donor to the Democratic Party. That he donated over \$3.5 million to the Clintons. And, according to one of report, he donated \$50,000 to Hillary Clinton in 2006. This was after his indictment.

I didn't know Ghislaine Maxwell was at Chelsea Clinton's wedding. And I find it so incredibly shocking, being a media person. I worked at CBS. How is that not anybody's news story, that now a convicted child trafficker who is known to have worked out deals with the most powerful people in the world. This child trafficker has been arrested, is in prison, and was at our presidential family's wedding, and no one asks any questions about that? That's not news, that's not a headline anywhere?

They're all part of the same groups. You know, if you think about the CFR or even just more private things, whether it's the Aspen Club or any, there's so many different groups that get together to gather, in a sense, right? And if you want to stay part of that country club, essentially, you don't go outing someone else's....

Well I mean, very simply put, you you...working in television you do know there's topics that are sort of third rails, and you are rising because you know how to toe that corporation's line. But I keep saying, and honestly, one of the things, when there's stories, we were just having a discussion, our team recently about a story that doesn't seem like it should be out there or wasn't. And I was like, Well, look, I always say, there's Del Bigtree's, , and Sean Stone's working at every news agency in the world. You know, we're all, we're out there. It's not, not everyone is evil and wanting to cover it up. And there's moments where you see opportunities where I can add, my executives are unaware of what this story actually is. I'm going to ask the appropriate questions, put it out. I'll probably get a slap on the wrist, where I'd be like, Oh, oh I didn't realize I wasn't supposed to ask the most obvious question there. And like, well, it was a good question, but you should know. And if it's in these really strange spaces where media seems to be in control, where maybe, super high up, they know why we're avoiding this story, but the rest don't. You have to, you get away with it, like I don't really. Okay Del, just don't do it again and you move on.

Well, and wasn't it the, was it CBS or one of those news networks that basically censored their reporter after the Paul Pelosi story, when he was, when he said some things and it was based in truth, like he had ultimately, there's so many questions around that, that whole thing. You would think that one or two, if they were not all controlled, would say, this is where we should maybe question it. And I mean, it's good. Tucker Carlson tends to do that, right? But he's his own entity. I'm saying, but as an organization, you would think that these networks would have a little bit more, if they were free, if they were truly free, place to say, hey, these things don't make sense. These things don't add up, we're going to question it. That's our job as journalists, is to question it. But no one questioned it? So what does that tell you? That's....

His business appears as we know it to be providing entertainment through underage girls or maybe of age, but, depending on the scenario. What do you think people in this country actually believe in, are they just willing to accept that?

There has been, I think, some social consequence. We've seen it in the US with people like Weinstein going, obviously he went to prison, but like Kevin Spacey is not working anymore. So it's almost like there's a faux pas where people are like, Well, let's just keep a little distance from you. Think of...

That's how I think how things are are really done. So when you're talking about the congressman who gets elected for two years and has to consistently get re-elected, right, they're just doing favors essentially. The same with the senator, just favors, the president. It's the president of a corporation. He doesn't hardly know anything, goes in there for four years, maybe eight, and they're out. I mean, it's a joke. You don't really run that thing, it's a show.

Monarch is an operation that was created by the United States government to create spies for other countries. They use children for the purpose that they are easily integrated into multiple personalities because they can dissociate. Monarch is a program that is run by Michael Angelo Aquino, who was an Army Reserve colonel at Presidio. He is also the leader of the Temple of Set. He also runs a child daycare center. He also is involved in human sacrifice.

So first of all, Monarch, when he's saying that, is what he's saying, is that, this dissociation thing that he's talking about in children that you can sort of, what would be the use of that?

This is what I've, a lot of this research that I've done since, really since college or high school college and it's conversations with people, some on the record, some off the record. What you're looking at is generational trauma within families. Some of it you could say is Masonic networks, or you could say this lineage and how. Look, you can think of it this way. Like your father went to war, and then he goes, You have to go to war, too, right? That's like a benign, that's benign, it's not benign. It's like. But it's relatively benign compared to what these people are doing, which is, I was raped. Now it's your turn because you're going to, we're going to basically make you into a man, right, that's kind of, that's part of the psychology of of what's going on here. But it's really much more compartmentalized in the sense of, these families are oftentimes part of bigger cult networks that are in power, whether they're involved in governments like in, Belgium was very involved with this in the 80s. There was a great scandal that came out exposing the relationship of politicians with Dutroux case, and it nearly brought down the government. But then they they hush it up, they made it all about Marc Dutroux. They forgot about his accomplice, who was...

Just like we just did with Epstein and Ghislaine. Like, we know that the real story is not these two people, it's the list of people that apparently are running our government right now that you have, FBI, our own government has it.

There's the splitting of personalities that takes place through trauma. Anyone who understands the nature of trauma in children, right. The greater the trauma oftentimes creates a dissociation so that people then can either have multiple personalities. Cathy O'Brien talks about this in the documentary, or, at nothing else, you can numb. So what happens when you're a traumatized child is that you, as we see in our society now, you can then become a more sociopathic business person. I mean, if need be, you could be a killer. But the point is that you, within our power structure, if you're able to dissociate and have no compassion or empathy, it's very, it's much easier to rise in the ranks of a of a corporate structure.

So in the sense of how this system is designed, essentially, there are different ways of, how do you say, there are different facets, it's very complicated. It's like there are different facets to it. There are people who literally put their own children through this to basically groom them, and then there's the grooming of others, and then there's oftentimes the murder of other children by the children or by the grown-ups for ritual purposes, right, because there's, there is a religious, you could say, a religious component to some of these these cults. Eh, it's like it's so multifaceted. There's a spiritual component because when you're are traumatized, they believe that they can sometimes create like a Rosemary's Baby kind of situation where I can bring a demon or a devil or a spirit, a God, as you know, as they might consider it, a deity, through this child, through this being. So complicated, it's so vast.

You know, this, why the series, we get into a lot of, we go into a lot of areas that are supernatural, you could say. Beyond beyond the physical realm. Because demons and angels and all these things have been discussed in every culture, right, across the planet for thousands and thousands of years. To me, there's credibility to that, to the fact that every culture has their own rendition of these stories, what, whatever you want to call them, craft in the sky, lights in the sky, powers beyond this realm. And, it's just, it's very, it would be very facile to just dismiss it all because now we're in an enlightenment age that this is all hocus-pocus, when we really understand nothing of our reality, right? The more we understand about the science of our reality, the more we're confounded by it, right? The nature of consciousness, whether all this is all a simulation, right? The simulation theory is coming out. What's really running the simulation, right? What's beyond the simulation? You cannot be scientific or assume science, and then pretend that you understand what's really happening on this planet.

They're like, no, I mean, we are talking about, they're talking about releasing viruses and mosquitoes, releasing viruses in the air from airplanes, to protect us from the natural viruses. I mean, this is how far this has gone. It's going to be a battle of man's viruses in me versus God's viruses in me and which will prevail. If you look at the issue of sexuality, I mean, I can't look at it. You're you are, you first of all, hate your body, I can't see it anything.

None of us ever decided at any point in our lives to move back into a teepee or a longhouse, give up our cars. Something that actually my mom has been swearing she was going to do her entire life.

But I want to say this. You know, I run into people sometimes and they're very, very depressed because they've got some darkness that they're looking into and they can't shake it. Frankly, I just don't know that that is what we're supposed to be doing in this life. I think we should be seeking love and joy first and foremost. So if you're a person that can look into these things and do what you can and not give up your sense of power and your sense of self, and ultimately your sense of joy and love, then have at it. But if you're a more sensitive person and these things really kind of unearth your day, I would say leave it to someone else and focus on those things that make you feel beautiful and wonderful and realize that there's always flowers growing, that the sky is blue, God exists, and everything is going to be okay.
