Hello and welcome to HighWire. It's Thursday, death-defying talk without the safety net. Speaking of talk, I think we all heard the story yesterday that broke. A Congressman was shot by a lone gunman in the middle of a baseball practice. I want to talk about this today. As, you know, I know that we all heard a lot about it, but I sort of wanted to bring my personal thoughts to this issue because I think things are getting out of control in this country and I think we're forgetting who we are, how great this nation is, and how our diversity and our acceptance of diversity and our acceptance of opinions is what makes us great. We don't live in a nation where everyone thinks the same. It's not mandated by our government to agree. We don't live in North Korea, where you are only allowed to talk about one political system or one idea. We have voting. You know, we have a democratic system where we choose our Presidents, we choose our Senators, and we choose our Congressmen. And we do that by going to the ballot box and voting. And if those representatives don't do what we like, then we can vote them out. That's how this system works, and I feel like we're forgetting that that's how we deal with our discourse, that's how we deal with our disagreements. It's great, throughout time, we've always argued about politics. Our system was designed so that those, you know, those arguments would lead to some sort of compromise in the middle where we would find the truth, and I believe that our founding fathers set this up in a way where, you know, we have two parties, I wish there was more.

But certainly in the middle of these two parties, the compromise between them is what makes them great. Those are where the ideas come from, is we have to find some way to get along, to be able to communicate with each other. And we're losing that because there's too much vitriol in this discussion. It's okay to disagree with each other. I keep saying over and over again, we've got to have these discussions at our Thanksgiving dinner tables, at our, you know, Easter tables, or when we get together on Sundays or when we're out with a drink with friends, we should be having these dialogs. Because I think if we speak to each other as human beings, what we'll realize is we agree on more than we disagree. I believe that, you know, sure, this is just a crazy man, as any other. They can call him a terrorist, you can call them whatever you want, this is one lunatic that ran out into a baseball field with a gun. But what is pushing this? Why are we accepting that this is becoming a part of our society? We're accepting it because we are so used to this vitriol. We've got comedians holding up bloody heads of the President of the United States and then being upset that somehow that didn't forward her career.

These types of things have got to change. We've got to start learning how to talk to each other and not scream at each other, to get down to the facts and the points of the matter, not call each other names. And I wanted to talk about this today because it's something that I had to deal with personally. As many of you know, I was a progressive liberal Democrat from Boulder, Colorado, my whole life. I've been an environmentalist my whole life. I remember watching television and thinking to myself, I think I've even said to friends, you know what? I can pick out a Republican even when I see them on tv because there's something evil about them, there's something wrong with them. I remember making statements like that, and feeling justified in that, that the only way that this government would work correctly is if Democrats were in charge. But then I ran into this issue with the CDC whistleblower. I ran into the issue of vaccines. Many of you know, I was a producer on the daytime talk show The Doctors, celebrating the best that medicine has to offer. And then I found out we had a whistleblower at the CDC, and my investigations over the last few years have proven to me that our vaccines are contaminated, they're problematic, and children are in danger. And Democrats are taking huge amounts of money from the pharmaceutical industry, and the pharmaceutical industry is paying off our health agencies, and everybody is looking the other way.

And in these conversations with Republican senators or congressmen, I found myself sitting across from them at the desk thinking, this is a great guy. This is an open-minded person, this is someone that I would love to be able to say, was the grandfather of my kids. I would let them babysit my kids, I'd let them hang out. Now, that was hard for me to accept. I really had one moment where I was sitting in New York actually talking to a politician, having that exact thought and remembering how I used to say, I can pick out a Republican a mile away, there's something wrong with them. And in that moment, I realized I was the one that had been wrong the whole time. And what I want to remind people now is that every one of our elected officials, they have children, they have grandchildren, they have ideals that they were raised with, they have ideals that they grew into. They have ideals that have changed.

And when we sit there and we make people evil and we think about them as evil because they don't agree with us, we are creating a disease that will take us all down. The truth is, is Republicans and Democrats, whether you like it or not, actually are much more similar than you would ever believe. I know that because I talk to them all the time now. I don't just sit in my house and watch the news. And this is what this really comes down to. The news is making us scream at each other and argue at each other. Why are they doing it? Because they get ratings from doing it. If they can get you so amped up and angry, you'll tune in tomorrow to get angry all over again. We are addicted to our anger and we're becoming more and more addicted to our anger as time goes on in this nation. I remember being irate that Bill Clinton was dragged through the mud because the Monica Lewinsky issue, which to me just didn't have any, you know, it had no precedence or had nothing to do with how our government ran. But then when George Bush was getting dragged through the mud, I didn't really care, I looked the other way. Then Obama came in, all of a sudden, because he's black, he's being attacked, it must be because he's an African-American. And now I can say because I consider myself now politically marooned by a topic that now makes me see things in a totally different light, everybody in government needs to evolve.

Our system is not working. I don't think either one of these parties perfectly represents me, and I don't think they represent you as well as you think. But Donald Trump is not African-American, and I think if you look at it, we are attacking him just as much as we did President Obama. So is this the future of this nation? Are we seriously going to start trying to arrest a President as soon as they get the job? Are they going to be under indictment and investigation the moment they enter the job? I mean, look it. I'm not saying that we shouldn't be investigating this Russia issue or is the Trump administration connected to it? That has to go on, let's get to the bottom of it. But let's stop calling people evil. If we scream at each other, if we only tune in to our own, you know, perspective, if I'm an MSNBC person and you're a Fox person and never the twain shall meet and we cannot talk, then this nation is over. I want to look at some of the quotes that come from our founding fathers that put this system together. This is Benjamin Franklin, says, "We must all hang together, or assuredly we shall all hang separately." I think that's pretty prophetic. This nation is one of the greatest in the world, but it's only great if we can have these conversations, if we have freedom of speech.

"So strong is the propensity of mankind to fall into mutual animosities, that where no substantial occasion presents itself, the most frivolous and fanciful distinctions have been sufficient to kindle their unfriendly passions and excite their most violent conflicts." When some lunatic is running out into a baseball field, and we think, well, he's just a crazy person, would that crazy person have done that if we weren't all screaming at each other every day? Is that person possibly an antenna of our anger? Are they taking in our anger? Are they only tuning in to news stations that continuously and over and over again make the leaders of our country look like they are evil, that they're out to get us, that they're trying to destroy us? Those are the types of things that make crazy people go over the top. And in the end, we are all responsible. Those were our brothers and sisters on the field, as, you know, I think there was a great photo of the Democrats all huddled around in prayer, because the truth is, is those politicians know the truth. They know that they go out to lunch every day with their Republican counterparts, that they're friends of theirs, that they share a common goal to find what's great in America and make that prosper.

I doubt very few of the Democrats out there went yes, finally, one down because someone got shot. I know you got an uneasy stomach, you know, feeling in your stomach when it took place, as I did. But the truth is, is the day before that shooting, you were probably thinking, I wish they would just disappear, I wish we could get rid of the Republicans, but the moment it happens, it's a wake-up call. And I'm saying, please, let it wake you up. Let it wake all of us up. That it's time to come together.

If this is going to continue to be the great nation we dream of, if the future of our children relies on the power of this nation and the beauty of this nation and our diversity and our discourse, then we must take responsibility for this shooting. We must say it is time to come together and learn to have debates, not learning to be angry. Anger gets us nowhere, it's not doing anything for us, and it's destroying this nation. I've had a wake-up call because I realize that these guys and these women are doing the best they can, the way they see fit. And if it doesn't work for you, then vote them out. And if the major population in your area decides that's who they voted in, then we have to accept that. We have to continue to speak out about the issues we see with the choices that those politicians make, and maybe in the next election we can turn it around. But we can't go around arresting everybody that doesn't agree with us, and we certainly can't go around shooting everyone that doesn't agree with us. And if we dream about these people disappearing, or we call them evil or crazy or use names that take away their humanity, then we have lost our humanity. I think this is a serious issue, and I was very disturbed yesterday, as someone that now sees that these are just political parties, they're just ideas.

But we are all brothers and sisters and we are all human beings. We must never forget that. That's what I think yesterday reminds all of us. Please, let's wake up, let's find our humanity again. Alright, today I want to talk about, I got a lot of great things to talk about. We got Kent Heckenlively coming up in a little while and we're going to get to the bottom of the Dr. William Thompson story at the CDC. You're going to get a couple of perspectives. Obviously, I've made a movie about it, Kent's had a book. But first, I want to talk about this crazy headline I saw. "Study links mosquito spray to delayed motor skills in babies." You know, I hate to say I told you so, but I keep having to say I told you so. It's the way our science is working. Look at, this Naled, Naled is the chemical that they looked at. China did a study and found that there was motor delays. So at nine months, the researchers found deficits in motor function. We're destroying the motor functions of our babies with mosquito spray. This is happening in Dade County, Florida. I think I've heard that they're just about to start spraying today. You're about to start being sprayed with a mosquito spray that China has just discovered causes motor delays in your infants. Folks, hello. We've talked about Zika, we've talked about what a ridiculous scam this entire thing is, and now we're poisoning ourselves because of this false story.

Put some on your Cheerios in the morning. Don't worry about it, it's perfectly safe. Folks, it's not safe. It's never safe to spray any chemicals all over yourself. We should be trying to eliminate the amount of chemicals in our environment, in our air, in our food, in our water, in our vaccines. Yet what do we do? We keep adding more and more toxins. Our babies are being born in a toxic environment, and we have people running our government that should, as I just said earlier, need to be voted out of office. If they think it's a good idea to spray mosquito spray in the air all over you randomly so that your babies, your pregnant wives, your mothers, these kids, everybody's breathing this stuff in. And then when we see studies around the world, European Union bans it, China discovering it causes motor delays in kids, and yet here in America, we're spraying this exact poison on our own citizens. It's ridiculous and it's crazy, and we've got to start seeing the pattern. Who is making these decisions? Do you think these are just politicians? Every time we look somebody owns a mosquito spraying company or somebody's taking, you know, financing from Monsanto to get into office. These are the type of discussions we need to be having.

Who is paying to have these individuals in office? Who has got them there and who thinks it's a good idea to be spraying mosquito spray everywhere we go? We talked about DDT. This goes back years and years and years ago when we had those DDT vans driving down the street and kids dancing behind them, you know, inside of this cloud of insecticide. Insecticides are never good. They're designed to do what? Kill. They're designed to kill small bugs. Just because they're small doesn't mean that they're not injuring you. What makes you think you can kill an animal or kill a bug with a toxin and not have it affect you? I mean, it just goes beyond reason. Do you really need a scientist to tell you that this is safe? You should question that scientist, because it doesn't make any sense. And every single time, over, when we look back on it, we say, wow, that was a really stupid thing we were doing. And you know what happens over time? Sometimes people get arrested. I want to point out that we just saw this, Flint, Michigan. Five people were charged, I believe it was yesterday with involuntary manslaughter. Five people from our health agency in Michigan. Nick Lyon, the director of the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services, he was charged with involuntary manslaughter because they knew the water in Flint, Michigan was poisoned, but they didn't want to spend the money.

God knows who was funding them to keep this quiet. And people have died. Children have been poisoned. And now five people are up on involuntary manslaughter charges, finally. You know what, I wish the same thing had happened with the bankers that destroyed our economy. Maybe things are changing. Maybe we're figuring out that we've got to prosecute these people to make sure that this never happens again. I really wonder what's going to happen to the future of people that are spraying mosquito spray and injuring their babies and causing motor delays in Florida and Texas and probably up in New York. Well, there will never be, as I pointed out last week, a Zika-carrying mosquito because they do not live that far north. But one of the big stories is going to be the cover-up of vaccines. I can tell you, because I've investigated it. Just like I said last week, I've opened up these studies. When they're telling you vaccines are safe, they are lying. But it's pretty. Were in the pretty middle of nowhere, Nevada.

Alright, that's the VAXXED tour, and we're joined by Polly Tommey on the VAXXED bus. This is something I want to do more often because it's such an incredible work that the VAXXED team is doing out there. Polly, where are you?

Hi, Del. I'm here with Anu driving and Dr. Suzanne Humphries, and we're on our way to Salem. We're in Oregon.

You're in Oregon? Alright, awesome. How's the weather up there?

It's pretty miserable, I have to be honest. It's like being in England, but we're all good. It's fresh.

Excellent. So look at, you know, the work you're doing. I mean, how many? Just out of curiosity. So you've been traveling the nation, and you, I mean, I've worked with you, I had to jump off the bus because I can't handle your work ethic, you're out of your mind. You never stop, you never take a day off. But on average, how many interviews are you doing? And, you know, at first you were only doing interviews of vaccine injured children and people that have been injured by vaccines. How many of those types of interviews do you tend to do every day?

Well, well and sadly, we have to turn people away. There's not enough hours in the day when we stop somewhere to be able to do all the stories that line up for the bus. But we're averaging 10 to 15 stories at a stop. And it's quite unbelievable, there's a lot of coincidences out there, Del.

That's what we're saying more than anything else. And the unvaccinated stories are coming in thick and fast. And it's really not rocket science, these children are so healthy. We had four teenagers sitting on our sofa, unvaccinated teenagers, telling us that, one in particular that she's just checked out of public school now because there's so much disruption in the class, she cannot get any work done. So she's gone home. She's opened up her computer and she's educating herself because she's done with so much disruption in the class.

What do you mean by disruption? Like what's disrupting the class, the discussion around vaccines or people that.

No. No. People who cannot concentrate in class. So she's saying that the teacher is so distracted with ADD, ADHD, people on their phones, fidgeting, behavioral problems the whole time that nothing is getting done, she is learning nothing. So she checked out, like I say, went home, opened up a computer, and she's now doing online courses and way advanced. And the other teenager sitting on the sofa agreed that school was really, really hard to deal with because they couldn't deal with the disruption from the ADD/ADHD, psychotropically drugged other children. They were very honest about it, it's very interesting.

For you as ,you're, you know, obviously you're the mother of a child with autism, and Billy couldn't really go to a public school. He was, is that right? He had, he.

Yeah, he couldn't even sit down on a chair. You know, he had no understanding about what was being said to him. It was just absolutely no good for him. And we speak to a lot of parents with the same symptoms as Billy, and they do very, very well in specialized schools, schools that are more about lifelong skills rather than being put in a public school, just because, and I know this sounds harsh, but a lot of parents that want to have that piece of paper that say that their child graduated at the end of the day. You know, that's pointless to Billy. He's doesn't need a piece of paper.

Do you think, I mean, obviously, this gets to be a very touchy subject because obviously for people that have high functioning children that are maybe on the autism spectrum, they definitely want to have them around normal kids and they, you know, they want to integrate them into the education system. But are you hearing more and more that there's children that aren't injured that are finding that distracting or difficult in class? Does anybody have a solution? What are your thoughts on that?

Well, the unva-, what we're seeing, left, right and center, is the unvaccinated children are coming out of public schools and they're homeschooling because they just need to be fed way more than what's going on in school. And they're very happy, they're mixing in homeschooling classes ,and they're doing fantastically well. We're seeing very few unvaccinated children still in the public school system purely because of what I just said right now. And we are seeing a lot of vaccinated, really severe children, parents also taking their children out of the public school system because they are not catering for their needs, lots of bullying going on. So it's a bit of a mess, the education system right now. This is a real problem.

Do you think, I mean, where do you think this is going to go? Where's our edge? I mean, is our education system grinding to a halt over this issue? I mean, obviously, the cost has got to be astronomical to deal with the extra teachers and everything that's needed for these kids that are suffering from either severe ADD/ADHD or their high-functioning autism. It just, it sounds like chaos in the classroom.

It is chaos. Speaking to educators, we spoke to one last night at a Q&A, and she said it's really, really impossible to be able to maintain discipline even in the classroom because of so many behavioral disabilities. And again, so many are on these psychotropic drugs, taking them erratically, and they'll go back to the doctors and they're just given pumped more and more psychotropic drugs. And with that come a lot of behavioral difficulties and side effects. So the teachers have no training to deal with an unvaccinated, extremely clever person mixed in with a Billy type situation where you can't sit down on a chair, mixed in with ADD/ADHD. It really has to be sorted out. You, I know it sounds cruel, but you're going to have to separate these kids out. Otherwise these kids that want to learn and just not going to be able to get the education that they need. And, you know, for this young teenage girl, Del, to take herself out of school and educate herself from a computer because she just can't get enough education into, that's a sign of the times. That's what's happening.

Do you worry, I mean, because I know we've talked about this in the past, we haven't had to lately. You know, one of the concerns I have is that we don't want to push away the parents that have vaccinated their children and their children are doing fine in school, and saying that all vaccinations are bad or vaccinated kids are bad, or that even having, you know, being on the spectrum is bad. But how do we have this discussion? How are we going to frame this discussion so we can bring people together to at least admit this is not the classrooms we grew up in? We were able to focus, we had honors classes, children were being accelerated through the education process. And now instead of having honors classes, we have these exploding special needs classrooms. How are we going to frame this discussion so that we all come together and say, that's just not the child that I had?

Okay, I think we need to show them what can be done. So, for example, we are seeing that the special needs children, children that are injured, are vaccine injured or whatever, they're not getting the education that they deserve in there. They get, the bullying is horrific in these schools. Toby told me, please never send Billy to the school that he was at. He sees the children are being called retard in the corridor, no one's sitting with them having lunch. They're not having any friends in the playground. It's a dire situation out there. I say, let us build these amazing lifelong learning schools where the ones that are really academic, that can't cope with with the lighting in schools and the bullying, get their own special business centers and we help them with their lifelong skills. Let's give us a chance to show you what we can do, where there'll be a much better environment for children with special needs, where they really get to learn the way that they should do, not the way that society says they should in a bullying school, a public school where nobody's gaining in public school right now. Nobody's gaining.

Well. Well, I think, I know that you're working on that, I know that you're working with the Autism Trust back in Austin to try and build just that type of center. Do you think the consensus of parents of these special needs kids, do you feel like they are in agreement with that, that they want specialized education versus just sticking them in a regular classroom?

I think that the parents with children like Billy would absolutely agree that we need to, they need lifelong skills. They need to be loved and nurtured and have friends and buddies and all of the things that we're just not getting in the public schools. But there are parents who want their children to mix with so-called typical children, and they want that. But I do say to them, please be careful that you're not doing what's right for you. Think about your child, because when we go past your playgrounds and we see your high-functioning children in the playground with no friends, I can do better than that with the schools that we're building. I don't want your child to be lonely and bullied and sad. I want your child to be embraced and have an education that child deserves. And it may be a little bit different from the typical child, but that's the way it is at the moment. And it really can be done. But please don't do what's right for you as a parent, please think about your child. Harsh words, I'm sure will cause a big debate, but that's how I feel. I feel strongly about it.

Polly, we have to have this debate and I think we have, you know, clearly our education system's not designed for this. But what I want to remind people is this is brand new. These are brand new discussions that we're having to have because we have a huge tidal wave of injured children, of children that cannot cope in the classrooms the way we did. Being antsy in your chair the way I was when I was a kid, I know they will say, well, I had problems with attention. So did I, but I didn't disrupt classrooms. What we're talking about now is brand new. It's a brand new issue. It is clearly an environmental issue because it is so brand new. If it was a genetic problem, these kids were being born with this because of our genes, we would have been seeing it throughout time. We would have always had these children there. We would always have autism there. They have not been there, and now our schools are dealing with a brand new problem they don't know what to deal with. I think there's a lot of debate on how we're going to move forward with this. And clearly, clearly, we have not found the answers. And one of the things that I think Polly is trying to achieve, driving all over the country with a new, and Dr. Suzanne Humphries and the great work they're doing on the VAXXED tour, is we must stop.

We must stop growing this group of special needs children. We can limit it. We know these are environmental issues. It's probably not just vaccines. I'm sure our food supply, glyphosate, all of these things are adding in. This is what the Children's March for Humanity that's happening this weekend is going to be all about, is fighting, the influx of environmental toxins into our lives are being injected into us, they're being fed to us. We're drinking it. We must stop this because these are not the classrooms we grew up in, and it's not because we're suddenly recognizing it for the first time, it was not there. That's the fact. It was not there. These kids were not there. We did not have this crisis. We have a crisis. That's what VAXXED and the great work you, Polly, Anu, Dr. Suzanne Humphries, that's the work you're doing. I'm so proud of you guys. Keep up the good work. We'll check in with you soon, and I think Suzanne, we're going to get her in studio in the next week or two, so I'm looking forward to that. Keep up the great work. You're waking up the minds of America and the world. Keep up the good work and we'll check in with you soon.

Alright. Thanks, Del. Bye.

Alright, bye. What got me on to this. I mean, look it. I know right now people are typing into their computers. These people are crazy, they're making this up, it's a lie. You know what? You have to do your investigation. If you actually just investigate, if you start looking, it really doesn't take anything beyond about a fourth grade reading level to start looking into the health studies they say have been done, and recognizing that we have a problem. They're not being done. These health studies, as I point out over and over and over again, are not being done correctly. We know. Look it, you know that the pharmaceutical industry lies to you. You know that they jack up the price of EpiPens because all they care about is making money. You know they're pushing OxyContin on children, even though we are going bankrupt in state after state after state because the addiction to OxyContin. This is a discussion we have all day long. How are we going to stop the pharmaceutical industry from pushing things into our kids and pushing things into us that we don't need? And what you have got to recognize is vaccines are no different. They've fudged the science on that the way they fudged the science on everything they push on this country. And what led me to that was the discovery of a man named Dr. William Thompson. He's a whistleblower at the CDC. I've mentioned him quite a bit. Most of you know, I made a film, VAXXED, but we're going to get deeper into it because we've got a guy that's written a book. And yes, books tend to be a little more thorough than 90-minute movies. But why don't you listen to this quote from Dr. William Thompson himself? And soon we have Kent Heckenlively coming up.

Here's the deal, is the CDC is, they're paralyzed. The whole system is paralyzed right now. And the whole branch is paralyzed and it's becoming more paralyzed. So there's less and less and less being done as the place just comes to a grinding halt. Really what they need is for Congress just to come in and say, give us the data and we're going to have an independent contractor do it and bring in the autism advocates and have them intimately involved in the study. When I talk to you, you have a son with autism, and I have great shame now when I meet families with kids with autism because I have been part of the problem. I shoulder that the CDC has put the research ten years behind, right. Because the CDC has not been transparent, we've missed ten years of research because the CDC is so paralyzed right now by anything related to autism. They're not doing what they should be doing because they're afraid to look for things that might be associated. I am, I'm completely ashamed of what I did.

That was Dr. William Thompson, the CDC whistleblower. For those of you who are unaware, he came forward in the fall of 2014 to make many statements like that, We are paralyzed right now, he says. We are, research is ten years behind when it comes to the safety of vaccines because we are so afraid of seeing a connection between vaccines and autism. He goes on to talk about other things like ticks. This is a man who's been working as one of our top scientists at the CDC. He still works at the CDC, so anyone that tells you that this story has been debunked, what I say is, how has he been debunked? Are you telling me we've made this man up? He's not a fictional character, he actually exists. He's actually made these statements, and he still works at the CDC, where he won awards and was awarded for almost every year of his work there. He's still there. He's protected by whistleblower status. He, you know, in the, you know, he came out in 2014. In July of 2015, Congressman Bill Posey stood before our Congress and said, please, please, I beg you, we must subpoena Dr. William Thompson. And still our government has done nothing. Now there's a brilliant book about this story about Dr. William Thompson called *Inoculated*, written by Kent Heckenlively. Kent, thank you for joining us today.

Great. Can I have Kent a little louder in my can so I can hear him? Alright. Kent, what is your book about? Sort of give me the quick synopsis on it. What does *Inoculated* cover?

Well, you know, like you, when the whistleblower story broke, I thought, great, this is the wonderful autism Watergate moment. And then nothing started happening, you know, months and years started going by and so, I'd written a previous book, *Plague* with Dr. Judy Mikovits about chronic fatigue syndrome and autism. And I thought, this story needs to be a book. Now, it was really kind of nice in the midst of writing *Inoculated*, I came to interview Andy Wakefield because I wanted to go over his work because I really felt like nobody had done the vaccine story from beginning to end, and the Thompson story was a perfect vehicle to go over this 30-year disaster that's taken place since the passage of the 1986 National Childhood Vaccine Injury Act. So I used the Thompson story as sort of a microcosm to tell this bigger story about how we changed the laws regarding vaccines so that vaccines are treated differently than any other consumer product. And it's not surprising to me, with my background as an attorney, when you have laws that are set up so that we don't search for the truth, that's not our ultimate value, we'll get such terrible injustice and such terrible outcomes as we've had with autism.

What, when people ask you about this, what do you think, what is the discovery? What does Thompson bring to us that we never had before? I mean, this has been a movement, you've been in this far longer than I have. You know, I think we've always been looking for a whistleblower, that was sort of what this movement needed. And Thompson brought that. What did he bring that we didn't have before and what do we now know?

Well, he brought was something really interesting and so, in putting together the Thompson story, I contacted the office of Congressman William Posey, and I got all the whistleblower documents. So I thought, what we really need, I mean, *VAXXED* is a fabulous movie, I've seen it like 3 or 4 times and you did a great job with it. But I thought, you know, I need some, somebody needs to put together the entire story, meaning that you can go over the documents. So you can read the documents, I mean, I've got over 400 footnotes in the book, but it reads like a thriller, it reads like a corporate thriller. And so what I think that Thompson gave us is, we in the autism movement have thought for a long time that the CDC wasn't doing their job. Now, you know, my training is as an attorney and I've been a science teacher for ten years, so I don't want to jump to conclusions, but when you looked at the evidence, you said to yourself, they are not doing the job of good scientists. Now, the next question is, why are they not doing a good job? Is it because they're so biased that they can't see that they're not, you know, following the rules of science, or is it something darker and more sinister? And I think that what comes through in the Thompson documents is that in 2000, 2001, as they started really looking at this, I really think that the scientists did not believe that vaccines were linked to autism. And my evidence for that is that they really put together good research plans to investigate the question, they did that both for mercury and autism and for the MMR vaccine and autism.

And what they did was they changed the research plan, they threw out data. So I find myself, you know, really frustrated, and it's something that really affects me very emotionally because I have been in this movement for a long time. So I've been in it for 15 years, so from around 2001. And what really gets me is that, is to realize that at the time I was getting involved in it, 2001, 2002, 2003, you know, there were scientists who were looking at this question and trying to figure it out, and they made a choice. And that choice was not to follow the data. And, you know, here we have these children who have been damaged by this. And, you know, I just, I wonder about the humanity of these people, because it's one thing to say, oh, I don't believe that. It's quite another to say, I've found this to be true and now we're going to cover it up and so, I mean, there were so many great people, you know, Generation Rescue, Mark Blaxill with, you know, Safe Minds, and they did fabulous work. And to realize that we had these wonderful people doing great work and they were lied to by the scientists, and our world continues to suffer because of what those scientists did.

You know, I have a theory because, I mean, obviously, you know, I know you, you know, we go over and over, you're a writer, you're also a lawyer. I come from the entertainment world. I always say law and entertainment are very similar because I think it attracts people that are passionate about what binds us all together in a society. How do we move amongst each other? You know, what are our personalities, how do we handle our difficulties, our ego interactions? So law is, you know, a lot of times people leave law and going into entertainment and vice versa. But, you know, I have a theory on this and I want to run it by you because I think you're right. When I look at, first of all, when you listen to the four hours of Thompson laying out how this happened and how it took place, and you really read the documents, I get a sense that these five scientists were good scientists, that really, I think they were, you know, whether you call it cocky or arrogant, they were certainly confident that they were right, that vaccines in no way could possibly be causing autism. That's really what's at the heart of VAXXED. There's other discussions we can have on thimerosal and things like that, but when you specifically look at this MMR study, they actually laid it out very well. The way, you know, the way they designed the study and what they're looking for, it's clear that they were going to find the issue if it existed.

But you can, you get the sense the moment Thompson starts telling us. I mean, it's almost like day one, he shows up with the first set of graphs looking at African-American children and they're going through the roof and we see, holy cow, there's a two point, I think it was 64 times increase of autism in African-American children. I mean, that's astronomical, that's a huge number, you know, just on those kids that got the vaccine between 12 and 18 months versus after three years old. Now we know and I don't want to like go through all the details, but obviously then they look at boys and then you have isolated autism, which is really all healthy children. Those numbers could be as much as seven times the amount of autism simply between those that got the vaccine on time versus those that waited till later. Now, I just wonder what was the thinking? How does a good scientist make the decision? I don't think there's some pharma guy outside the door that's paying them \$1 million as they walk out the door and saying, you've got to fix this study. I mean, it really seems to me that there's some sort of misguided idea of what the greater good is or what being good is all about, that gets in the way. I mean, for instance, here's what I think happened. What I think happened is they thought, maybe this study somehow is showing some tiny little anomaly. Maybe it's just happening to a few African-American kids and, you know, we're going to do more damage if we let the public know by telling them and spreading fear over this tiny little issue.

Maybe what we do is we just hide it, and it's going to be this little anomaly that takes place, it's an accepted casualty. I say it's something like this. It's sort of like some guy's driving down the road, flips their cigarette out the window. Now they know they shouldn't do it. You know, it's probably a misdemeanor if they get caught, they'll get pulled over by the police. But then that little crime, that little thing that wasn't supposed to lead to anything, starts a little brushfire. Now they see it on the news as a brushfire, do they turn themselves in and say, hey, I flipped the cigarette out, I can tell you how the fire started, or do they say, geez, I hope they put that out and nobody finds out. And then now houses start burning down, now people are being evacuated. Some people die, the thing becomes a gigantic mess. And what started as just a tiny little cover-up, what started as just maybe a little tiny break of the law, becomes a massive issue like I pointed out in Flint, Michigan, where now people are being arrested for involuntary manslaughter. What do you think of that theory? Do you think it was just, did they think it was just going to be a tiny little anomaly that would go unnoticed, and now we're skyrocketing towards 1 in 2 children by 2032? What's your thought on that?

You know, it's a great question, and I fall back on my experience as a lawyer, which is, you know, I generally find people to be honest, except when something goes terribly wrong, and then people start to lie, it's just human nature. And so that's why to me one of the most interesting parts of my book, *Inoculated*, is to go back into the history of when the National Childhood Vaccine Injury passed. And President Reagan, in his signing statement said, I am signing this bill with significant reservations because I don't think there's a proper separation of powers. And in fact, his own Justice Department, in a young assistant attorney general named John Bolton, who ended up later becoming our ambassador to the United Nations, said don't sign this bill. This is going to lead to injustice. And so I look at what our own Justice Department said in this law, and human nature. So I think it is human nature to say to yourselves, oh my God, I've run across something big, but it's not my place to say this. And what happens when you have people not taking authority is you have injustice of the very highest order taking place. So I really wrote the book as sort of like, okay, how do we go from this place of wanting to do something really good, which is protect kids against disease, to covering up the fact that we're harming them? And, you know, just by going through the documents, and so it's really kind of funny because I know that people like me and people like you, I know, we get attacked as conspiracy theorists, but heck, I wrote my book based on documents I got from Congress. So how can it be that, you know, I'm a conspiracy theorist when I'm using congressional documents that I got from the office of Congressman William Posey? You know, all I'm doing is telling the story in their own words.

That's what I say. You know, a lot of people, most of the knocks on *VAXXED*, the film, are by people that have never watched it, or those at very high levels that have watched it and want to scare everybody else away from seeing the truth. But it is undeniable when you look at it, I'm not in there telling, you know, saying this happened, it's not Andy Wakefield saying it happened. It's scientists from within the community, within the study. Dr. William Thompson is a legitimate whistleblower, he needs to be heard from. I, you know, what do you think about this? There's been a huge argument about, you know, I know Andy Wakefield got into a lot of trouble, and Brian Hooker, because they were, you know, Brian was recording these phone calls with Dr. William Thompson, which really makes up the only body, as I know of, of his statements. He's certainly provided 10,000 documents. Congressman Bill Posey has a much longer interview with him, I'm sure, but that's not available to the public, so I'm sure you're working with the same four hours of recorded testimony from Thompson that we are. And he was unaware that he was being recorded. Now, there were a lot of people that were upset that were in this autism vaccine movement because they felt like we outed a whistleblower that could have kept sharing information.

And I don't really want to get into the controversy of whether or not he'd still be there feeding us information, but what I want to say is, you know, some of the Snopes and these people debunk it, and they say, well, he didn't even know he was being recorded. I mean, in my mind, that makes him the cleanest whistleblower we've ever had because usually the knock on a whistleblower is that they have some other vested interest. They are either angry with their employers or they're blackmailing their employers or they're trying to get a payout. This is a man who literally is saying these things without anything to gain. You can hear in these phone calls him just letting this stuff off of his chest. I feel like you can almost hear the relief as he's sharing with Brian Hooker, you know, this confession. So to me, this is the cleanest whistleblower we've ever had, simply because he didn't know he was being recorded. There was no motive other than him just confessing and getting this off of his chest. Do you see it differently than I do?

No, I see it exactly the same way. And the way I look at it is that what was going on is, you know, this is a human story, and every story of people who are involved in this, I mean, they're not monsters. They can certainly do monstrous things, but they don't start out that way. They don't get up saying, hey, I'm going to cover up harm to children. But, you know, step by step, they end up doing exactly that. And so, I mean, I really wrote it in that way. And I know that there's a lot of different groups in the autism community, some people think that vaccines are a form of population control and it's been that way for 80 years and, you know, I understand that that may be the result, but I don't think that's where people started. And in going through my own research, in the fact that they came up with really good research plans that they didn't follow, makes me think that, you know, they're terrified and they're doing horrible things and it is affecting us as a species, and we just have to tell the truth and get that message out there.

I just got one more minute with you, Kent You know, I think, when I look at this, you know, people don't realize, we look back through time, we can go all the way back to polio and smallpox. Vaccines have had serious problems from the beginning. I feel like, look it, I think this is a well-intentioned idea. I think the idea of a safe vaccine program that truly protects us, makes us healthier, great, who doesn't want to be healthier, who doesn't want to be protected from disease? But it seems to me there was always these dirty little secrets in every single one of these studies and every single one of these vaccines, and I feel like they must have been, early on, must have been saying to each other, sweep that under the rug, hide that. We are going to work that out, but we want people to believe in this because we know where we're going. We know where the future of this is, and we want people to believe in it, so let's just hide the dirty secrets of this and we'll work on making better vaccines. And the truth is, I don't know if they gave up, if they got cheap and stopped spending money, but they've never gotten around the problems in vaccines, they never have. And now we have, you know, 72 injections or vaccines or however you want to count it, 54 vaccines, 72 doses in children by the time they're 18. And now, how do they admit it? How do they come out now and say, you know what, we've always been hiding this dirty little secret and the truth is, is we've never figured out a way around it.

I think that's exactly true. And, you know, people like me in this movement, it's kind of interesting because, you know, I'm a straight arrow kind of guy. You know, I'm a Dudley Do-Right kind of guy, you know. Raise your hand, I swear to tell the truth and the whole truth and nothing but the truth, so help me God, you know. As a science teacher, I tell my students, you don't hide data. And, you know, it's kind of funny because here I am spending my days teaching children to tell the truth and not hide data even when it goes against their hypothesis, and in my night times, I'm working on stories of of scientists, of grown-ups who are doing exactly that, and harming children. And so, you know, I said when I got into this fight and I realized the implications of it, you know, someday I'm going to stand before God and he's going to ask me, what did you do in this crisis, and I want to have a good answer.

Yeah. And you do have a good answer and you're doing brilliant work, Kent. It's an honor to have you on the show. You know, you're right when you say that, you know it, to me, I always say it's like a Dan Brown novel or one of these things. The deeper I get into this, you know, I didn't want to spend the rest of my life talking about vaccines. There's many other issue, political issues and things that motivate me. But this, you know, in a, you know, in sort of a twisted way, I say is a gift that keeps on giving. As far as a journalist or a researcher, it's just the deeper you go, the more corrupt and unbelievable this system gets. So where can we get Inoculated if we want to read this book? It is an engaging read. How do people get ahold of it?

What it comes down to is investigation. We have got to start thinking people. We've got to start researching for ourselves. You've got to stop trusting your health agencies. You've got to stop trusting the FDA, the CDC, the AMA, all of these letters that are telling you they know what's right, only you know what's right. Your instincts tell you what's right. If you're sensing that a vaccine is dangerous for your child, listen to that sense. Be human. Continue to love one another. We are all brothers and sisters, this is a very important fight in the greatest nation in the world. I'll see you next week.
