"Boston Herald Editorial Preying on Parents Fear." The final line of that entire column was "lying to vulnerable people about the health and safety of their children, ought to be a hanging offense." Folks, what is happening to the United States of America? Have we lost our minds? Are we seriously making criminal offenses out of people that want to live healthy lifestyles, eat organic food, drink fresh running water, go to chiropractors and masseuses and acupuncturists? That's how they want to handle health. That's going to make that a crime. What country do I live in? Seriously? Wake up, people. This is insanity. Hanging people that don't agree with your vaccine policies. Today we are going to talk about measles because this fear mongering is getting out of control. We can create that herd immunity of about 90% of the population.

Okay. Herd immunity. We've heard it on every single news station ad nauseum. Herd immunity is what we're trying to achieve with the vaccine program. I'm going to explain this to you in the same way that they do. We're going to talk about it. What is herd immunity? First of all, herd immunity was a natural immunity term when people naturally got measles back in the day when an entire town's very infectious measles. So an entire town got measles or like 60%. They said if 60% of the people got measles, that town would be protected for decades because those people would be immune to measles for life. So let's talk about this. But I want to make sure that you understand that we're trying to achieve this with vaccines. This is where we get into a lot of problems. Can vaccines achieve herd immunity the same way Natural immunity? Remember, natural immunity, when you get measles, you are immune for life. When you get a vaccination, you're immune for five, ten years. On occasion, somebody might hold on to an immunity to up to 20 years. So that's the difference. You get real measles, herd immunity for life, you're immune for life. When you get a vaccine ten years at tops, every once in a while, someone will be immune for 20 years. But let's talk about what they mean by herd immunity. I've got some army men here because really our children are in a war in this vaccine issue.

They are on the front lines, not us, our children. So let's look at it. Herd immunity would be right now. We want to imagine that herd immunity. We need 95% vaccine uptake in order to achieve herd immunity. That means that 95% of people have to be vaccinated for things like the measles or the mumps to be immune to create a cocoon. This is the idea. What we're trying to do is create a cocoon. All of these white little army men are children have been vaccinated out of 100. In most states. That's usually right around 97%, somewhere between 92 and 97% across this nation are children are already vaccinated. And we're doing it because we're saying these little guys, the immunosuppressed, these are the ones that either have leukemia or some sort of disease where they cannot be come in contact with the disease. So we build a cocoon of the vaccinated around our little guys right here. Okay. That's what we're trying to say. We're saying to protect that immunosuppressed child, we need everybody to be vaccinated in order to protect the cocoon. And what we're saying is get in the way of that happening is the unvaccinated these little kids that are being raised on organic food, on massage therapy, on homeopathy, on chiropractic, on these guys right here, 3% roughly across the nation of the unvaccinated children are putting our herd immunity group at risk.

They are dangerous. And any parent that raises their kid like this should be hung. Based on the Boston Herald's statement. This is the type of fear mongering people should be killed. They should go to jail if they decide to not vaccinate their kids. Here's what they want to tell you. What they want to tell you is the reason these 3% need to be vaccinated is because they might be in school and somehow let's talk about where's my where's my little measles virus. Alright. Let's imagine we have a little measles virus, right? They say it comes in, it can't get to the immunosuppressed because it's blocked by this little cocoon. Here it is. It's blocked. It can't get to them. Alright. But what happens if this measles comes from nowhere, Disneyland or something like that and hits one of these unvaccinated kids? Then suddenly they might have the measles. Okay. They don't spontaneously combust, by the way, with measles. They're not walking around with diseases all the time. They come in contact with it. Where did that disease come from? Maybe someone in another country, maybe somebody traveled or guess what? Maybe somebody got vaccinated and shed it onto these kids. Now, you've been told that shedding doesn't happen. You've been told that the vaccinated never shed the vaccine. Except I have news for you. Nobody in medicine believes that, especially not people that deal with immunosuppressed children.

Here's proof. Saint Jude, can we bring up this slide? Saint Jude says, Please let me read it. Exactly. What do I have it here? Basically. Essentially, I don't have the slide in front of me. But what it essentially says is that you cannot bring a newly vaccinated child into a NICU where children are at risk or into a cancer area where they're dealing with leukemia because your vaccinated children could shed onto them and give them what? Measles or give them a deadly disease. I'm not making that up. Saint Jude says it. Other, major cancer institutions all have these signs on the door saying if you've been newly vaccinated, please stay away. You are dangerous. So what does that mean? How safe are they when all the little kids around here are being vaccinated? So now measles is getting right in the middle. I'm going to my props are kind of falling apart, but you get it. Measles can still get you. Because this little guy just got vaccinated today and he's standing right next to your leukemia patient. And what happens? They get measles from it or this little guy goes up here, just got vaccinated and gives the unvaccinated kid measles. It could happen. But let's go back to the point. Let's say that they're right. Let's say that these three are unvaccinated. They get the measles. What they're trying to say is this is the biggest, most dangerous thing that could possibly happen because these little guys are walking through school, they're coming around and they may bump up against this immunosuppressed child and put them at risk.

Now, this has never happened so far in the history of this country. This is a hypothetical fear. And this hypothetical fear is why we are making laws that are taking all our rights away as parents. This is why now everyone in this nation is getting is starting to see laws that are force vaccinating every one of us. They want to force vaccinate, meaning inject you and your children with different toxins and viruses because they are going to say that you have to do it in order to protect these children. It's hypothetical. It's never happened. Vaccines kill children every single year. That is a fact. Yet no immunosuppressed child has ever died because they came in contact with an unvaccinated child carrying a disease. Could it happen? Sure. Could I win the lottery? Absolutely, it's possible. But why are we writing laws based on incredible hypotheticals with odds that are just through the roof? It's crazy. And now I'm going to obliterate herd immunity before your eyes. Herd immunity does not exist, cannot exist. And I'm going to show you why. Here it is. I'm going to be like Houdini. I'm going to destroy herd immunity for everybody. The AMA, the pediatric association, every single medical organization is lying to you.

And I'm going to prove it. Everybody driving your car right now listening to this at your home, you're watching this. If you're an adult, I have one question for you that is going to destroy herd immunity now, as we speak. If you were at your house, I'm going to ask you this. Everybody over the age of 25 years old, if you have not had a booster shot in the last ten years, honk your horn, raise your hand or scream out, Oh, snap. Because you know what? You are an anti-vaxxer. That's right. Your vaccines have worn off. You think I'm kidding? Look at the adult schedule. Can we bring up the adult schedule? Because the CDC is bringing two more vaccination shots for you of measles as an adult. Why? Because your vaccines have worn off. You can see the entire list. Every one of these vaccines you got as kids, they know they've worn off. And that's why there's this huge schedule of vaccines coming your way as an adult. And here's my point. So let's go back to the Armymen. If we can pull back from the Armymen, they want to say that herd immunity really exists because 95% of the kids in school are all immune because of the vaccines. But when we pull back, what do we see? We see the entire adult population of this nation is currently unvaccinated. That's right. If you have not gotten your booster shot in the last ten years, you could be a disease carrying person.

Certainly if measles comes in contact with you, you are going to get measles, as did all of the vaccine unknown stats that happened at Disneyland. More than half of the people that got measles at Disneyland were listed as vaccine unknown. Meaning you're in this black group, you were once vaccinated. We know when we look at your titers, they don't exist. We don't want to admit to the public that all of these people were vaccinated, adults that got measles because we don't want you to know this. It gets in the way of all the laws that are taking away your rights because we want you focused on this 95% of kids. But over 200 million adults are currently unvaccinated, roughly 60% somewhere in there of our entire nation. So we're not anywhere near 95%, which we need for herd immunity. We're somewhere around 40-50 at tops, 60% vaccine uptake. Now, I'm not saying that to make them rush in and force vaccinate all of you adults. The point is, is why is it measles running rampant? Why when Disneyland has measles, why did only 40 people catch it at Disneyland? Why did they only spread it across the nation to 120 people? Why are those the numbers if measles is so contagious and we need so many vaccines to protect us, why didn't it run rampant? You see, because you're healthy.

As adults you've gotten far enough away from your vaccines that you've established a real immune system. And that is the most important thing. And you know what? We think the vaccine may be 60, 70% effective. And we're going to have to give the vaccine over and over and over again. And if one of these kids misses one and becomes one of these adults, they can infect you. But one of these kids never, ever after they get measles, never again will they ever put you at risk. They will be a standing wall. Donald Trump would dream about a wall this strong. The unvaccinated kids that got the measles and are now protecting you for life. That is the truth. I just proved it. Over 60% of America is not vaccinated. That means herd immunity is a myth. And there you have it. Now, when we talk about measles, we've all watched it in the news. You've seen it this week. Somalis, those dirty, terrible immigrants are putting us all at risk. Did you watch it? Here it is.

So there you have it. Somalis are putting us all at risk. Does it sound like racism? Does that sound like what you used to read about when you read about how Hitler spoke of the Jews? They're the ones putting at risk. They're carrying disease. This population of Somalis that live in Minnesota, it's a very, very large grouping. I don't know why Somalis moved to Minnesota, but they did in large numbers. And when they got here, they got vaccinated. And those kids have the highest rate of autism in the entire country. 1 in 32 Somalis in Minnesota have autism. Now think about that. How is that possible? Did they have autism back in Somalia? They didn't even have a word for it. And now they come to this country. So people will say vaccines aren't causing autism. Well, if it's not vaccines, we better figure out what it is. Is it the air we're breathing here in America? Why is America creating autism? What is it about this country that creates so much autism that people come from another nation? They arrive here and suddenly they have a disease they have never even heard of? I want to get to the bottom of this. And one of the guys that was called in during this outbreak and they had a lot of questions, a great man by the name of Mark Blaxill with Health Choice. Is it do I have that right? Health choice. Mark, you got called the Somali, some of the citizens in Minnesota reached out to you and they wanted you to come and speak to them. What was your message to the people in the middle of this crisis up in Minnesota?

Well, I don't think I was trying to send a message. I was trying to share information. I think that the important thing for the Somali community is that their rights are respected. And and and in Minnesota, in the state of Minnesota, there are laws about vaccine exemption rights. And a parent can choose to vaccinate or choose not to vaccinate their child based on personal beliefs. And one of the problems you have is when these outbreaks occur is those rights come under attack. And public health authorities often step in and they're going to bully communities to do things that they might otherwise not want to do. And so I wasn't mendation to any anybody in the audience or any of our friends who invited us. There's a group actually in Minnesota called the Vaccine Safety Council of Minnesota, which was was invited and they sponsored the event. But I wasn't trying to tell a parent what to do one way or the other. My my message was, here's information. And you as a parent should make the choice.

We have laws. You have laws In Minnesota. They're saying that you have the right to not vaccinate, if you like, those of us in California that no longer have that right. Minnesota might be somewhere you want to move to because they still have freedom, freedom of choice, which is what our founding fathers, I think fought for. So, Mark, tell me, how big is this outbreak? What are we talking about? How many people have measles? How many of them are Somali? How many of them are unvaccinated? Do you have the stats on that?

I do, actually. They just got refreshed about 15 minutes ago. There were no new cases today. The total number of cases is 51. Most of those are Somali children living in Hennepin County, about 45, 46, 47. There are a handful of cases outside of the Minneapolis area. There are a small number of non Somali cases. There are three adults. But but it's largely a, you know, an outbreak among children, and most of them are have chosen not to vaccinate. So they're your little red soldiers still. Most of the folks that are getting getting measles.

So the vaccine rate at one point when the Somalis first came to Minnesota, they had one of the highest vaccine rates. They were somewhere around 95%. Correct?

And then. And what do they say? Why did they drop down? And what are we saying they're at now? What is their vaccine rate now amongst that?

I don't know the exact number. I've heard 40, 50% somewhere in that range. And I think that has by all accounts and these are anecdotal, all all of those accounts have come over concerns, rational concerns, I would emphasize, about autism risk, autism, as you said, autism rates in Somalia, in the Minneapolis Somali community, was actually corrected by a Somali mother at the gathering who had better information than me. There was a study done of the Minneapolis Somali community. There are other non Minneapolis Somali communities, and the rates may even be higher there. But it was 132 over 3%.

Let me speak to someone in that room. We have Ikram Mohammed joining us. This is a mother from that Somali community. Ikram why are the people in your community not vaccinating?

Um, I think Mark said it before. They're fearful of the they're fearful of having their children get autism. So that's the number one reason why. Because like you guys said, we're the highest in the nation and we're not that many. We're just a small community in Minneapolis. We are the largest in the United States, in Minneapolis. But. I mean, numbers speak louder than words. So that's the reason why.

What what are the autism rates in Somalia? How prevalent is autism where you come from?

I don't know now if they taken the MMR there, but we've never heard of it. We don't have a word for it in our dictionary and we've never heard of this illness to the point where when early 2000, when our children in Minneapolis started getting autism, they thought that they were possessed or something. Nobody knew what was going on.

Wow. How do you Mark, how do we get around that? I mean, I know you do a lot of study on this. I've seen you you know, you're one of these guys that you also have an injured child, correct?

Why is this not a part of the discussion right now in our media, the autism rate in this community? And I guess, my next question would be amongst these unvaccinated Somalis, since we've got the stats, we know that they're at 1 in 32 when they were 95% vaccinated. Is the health department in that area doing the stats and finding out if the unvaccinated children in that community are also at 1 in 32 rate of autism?

I don't believe there's a study of vaccinated versus unvaccinated Somali children. No. It would be a logical place to do it, just like the Amish would be a logical place to do it. And the Amish, by the way, a few years ago had the largest outbreak of measles ever, you know, in recent years, and no one ever heard about that. So we somehow don't want to attack the Amish, but we do want to attack the Somali.

If we were truly a scientific nation and we really believed in science, when you see a community that has 1 in 32 autism and you have the CDC telling us that they are investigating this, they're trying to figure out what's going on. You have Sanjay Gupta saying we just don't know what's causing autism. We know it's not vaccines. Well, okay, Why isn't our entire scientific community descending into this area of Minneapolis to really investigate this? You have a perfect control group. They all come from the same place. They probably have similar diets. They have, similar genetic structures because of where they come from. It's the perfect scientific study. And you're telling me we haven't looked at the unvaccinated community to see did their autism drop? That hasn't been done.

No. And I think it hasn't been done because nobody in a position of authority really wants to find the answer. Because when you if you did do an honest study and actually there was an honest study that was just published and then retracted after, you know, after an assault that showed that fully vaccinated children are at greater risk of autism than unvaccinated children. So I think the answer is out there. But people in power don't want to find it. And so they'll pretend like they're doing something. But but they don't. And when they do things, what has happened and you know this as well as anyone, Del, they'll find an elevated risk of some vaccine exposure, whether it's MMR or thimerosal or and we haven't even looked at the whole program. They'll find that. They'll often find that and then they will lie about it and they will cover it up and then they'll publish something that says there is no effect when in fact the first the time they did it, honestly, they found an effect. So we have a really, really bad situation of corruption in the government that is covering up the autism epidemic, covering up vaccine damage. And and so when when and then when confronted with a minor outbreak, this is an occasion for them to exercise their muscle and their power. And they're going to.

I also work in in our community and come in contact with a lot of moms and we see not even a handful of children under the age of five now that has been diagnosed with autism. So the numbers are going down. I don't know statistics, but within our community, word of mouth is big. So when when things like this come about, of course, we're going to travel fast within our small community.

My my cousin's child has autism. I know a lot of people with autism. I could there are so many moms who have not one but two children with autism in the Somalian community whose children are, you know, the youngest, seven, ten, 12. We have a lot of teens that are affected by this.

Well, look, this is what the news story should be. This should be a part of what we're hearing in our mainstream media and the fact that we're avoiding this part of the topic. Is she right? Is Ikram right when she says that in her in her communities where she's seeing the children that are now being born have a lower rate of autism than those that were fully vaccinated when they arrived here? These are the questions everyone in this country should be asking, not just the unvaccinated, the vaccinated, because we're giving more and more vaccines every day. A country where everybody is forced to vaccinate, everybody is forced to get adult vaccines. We have to be able to question medical procedures. Why would oatmeal be beneficial? Oatmeal has like no nutritional value whatsoever. The best thing about oatmeal, I think, is if you were to eat the cardboard box, that would actually be more nutritious if you want to lower your lipids down.

But, I just know personally, I can't. I literally said to my wife, there's like two weeks ago, no more oatmeal for me. That makes me crazy. Two hours from now, one egg, or an avocado, and I can go until noon, 1:00. So you've written some books. You know what? If we want to know what it is that you've learned because obviously, you're doing well. And I guess I would ask you, did this hurt your practice coming out on this? Did this destroy your credibility?

My book, The Paleo Cardiologist, 17 chapters over 300 References. Right. Science. Science. Science, Science. I've got it all inside the book. I talk about vaccines in the book. Not to say don't vaccinate, although I am clearly anti-vaccine, I'm pro immunity for children and anti-vaccine. I say in there, if you have cardiovascular health issues, look to the heavy metals. And I have a whole chapter called Heavy Metal Madness. And where do we get heavy metals from? And heavy metals like aluminum and mercury and lead and arsenic? Well, some of that stuff comes from vaccines. So before you want to run out and get your annual flu shots, understand that mercury is very damaging to the cardiovascular system. The graph actually shows that measles was already on a massive decline before the vaccine ever arrived. You can see that 98% drop in the mortality of measles in the 1960s. In fact, I think if you look at this other chart, you can see that the death rate of measles in 1963, if you go right down that column. Yes. I'm giving you graphs, facts from the CDC. This graph shows you 0.2 per 100,000 people in 1963 died from the measles. That's one out of every half a million. So you may want autism and you're going to get it because we're at 1 in 45 in our society. Move up to Minneapolis. If you're Somali, you'll be at 1 in 32. So you can try it out.
