Can you just leave the little penguins alone? For God's sakes? Let's just read the article about this. You have a few of the details. "More than 5000 little penguins will be VAXXED against bird flu. How will this protect them?" That goes on to say, "the colonies at Phillip Island and Saint Kilda are home to around 40,000 penguins. Because large numbers of birds live close together and the virus is highly infectious, bird flu poses a significant threat." It goes on to say that "little penguins are already under pressure from invasive predators, such as cats and foxes and doctors in blue smocks, artificial light roads and overfishing. Capturing wildlife to vaccinate them is difficult, particularly because the bird flu vaccination requires to be caught twice," at least for now. "Former senior NIAID official pleads guilty to charges connected to concealing federal records during Covid 19 pandemic." And you go into this and it reads, "according to his guilty plea, Morens Coconspirator one Coconspirator two another and others conspired during the Covid 19 pandemic to defraud the United States after NIH terminated Coconspirator one's grant." This is Rand Paul's emails with compliments of Senator, because now we have all this information and this is during the pandemic, the vaccine was just developed, emergency use authorization, and it's beginning to roll out. And this is Fauci in this email here, he says things are starting to move with my involvement with the Biden team, Biden is concerned about making sure that he reaches 100 million doses of vaccine in the first 100 days. So they have a Zoom meeting. I'm not going to read this whole thing. And he said, we're going to have all these people in a meeting, and you can see all the people in the meeting. Um, he's trying to ban federal funds for flock cameras. He's urging other states to do this as well. Congressman Thomas Massie also pushed to put forth a bill as well. What they're trying to do is strip federal funding and security grants to municipalities and police departments that are using flock cameras. That's a big deal. It's cutting off their funding. They do have control of the purse strings. So they're using what they have to try and stop this. But what are the bigger implications as this moves out? Well, here's an Ohio professor talking about this while he was testifying recently about flock cameras and really our basic rights here in the United States. Take a listen.

It's my professional opinion that flock is a dystopian violation of our rights. And what I mean by that, what I mean by that is that it inverts the very nature of how police are supposed to function. So in traditional investigations, a crime is supposed to happen first, and then detectives are supposed to identify a list of plausible suspects, and then those suspects are placed under investigation. But under flock, we are all everybody in this room every day, every time we get into our cars, we are all under investigation at all times for all crimes. Then when a crime actually does occur, the police have a list of pre investigated suspects. That's you. That's me. That's everybody in this room who gets in a car. That's everybody in this city. So today in Columbus, our constitutional rights, especially our Fourth Amendment rights, are flagrantly violated every single day as a matter of regular government policy.

So yeah, I mean, we're all pre-crime pre-crime. There's movies made on this, obviously dystopian movies, but the bigger conversation here is not just flop. So that's the lead in, but there's a lot of other now companies jumping into this mass digital surveillance space that are like an accordion out trying to keep up with these. Here's one ToKa. I'm gonna read these headlines here. "Flock's, lead investor, also backs a company that can alter security footage." So again, Flock's lead investor is invested in this company. Toka reportedly lets clients hack cameras, alter footage, and erase evidence without leaving forensic traces. Why would they want to do that with license plate reader cameras that are watching everybody at the same time? We don't know. But this is the backer, Andreessen Horowitz. He's a major funder of these rounds of flock safety and Toka. So this is one owner. And these are private companies that have this. But it goes on further. We have axon. Axon plugs into flock and it it grabs information from that license plate reader, license plate reader company flock is building a massive people lookup tool. A leak shows and you go into this article and it says the news turns flock already a controversial technology into a much more invasive tool, potentially able to link a vehicle passing by a camera to its owner, and then more people connected to them through marriage and other associations. So it scrapes artificial intelligence, scrapes the internet and looks for everything. The second you move past this camera finds out everything about you. It's creating this dossier on you and these files, files and files.

I mean, you question like, maybe that's why we need the data centers. But let me let me show you this, this really this graphic here just to show the interconnectedness. You can have flock Nova, you have Tosca there you have something called carbine that turns on your phone's live camera, microphone and GPS. When you call 911 Paragon signal, trace all of these and you can see it's really only about two, maybe three companies, three funders that are owning all of this private corporate surveillance in, in, in hands that are not the governments. Governments have no say in this. These are private companies that have all this data on individuals, very intimate data. What could go wrong? Can we trust them? Do police need this information? Maybe. But can we trust that? Because I remember in 2020, CNN putting this post out on then Twitter saying "Kentucky will record license plates of those who show up to mass gatherings, such as church services, and will provide that info to local health departments, who will in turn, order those individuals be quarantined for 14 days." Imagine what that was six years ago. Imagine we've come so far in that short time. What they would have done with the information they have now, everyone you know would be quarantined because they could tell who you who you met. Yeah. In fact, I think we have an HHS secretary, uh, Kennedy here, who, before he went into HHS, gave us a vision of this during the defeat the mandates march at Washington, D.C.. Take a listen.

Well, we're saying today is what I call turnkey totalitarianism. They are putting in place all of these technical, technological mechanisms for control. We've never seen before. It's been the ambition of every totalitarian state, from the beginning of mankind to control every aspect of behavior, of conduct, of thought, and to obliterate dissent. None of them have been able to do it. They didn't have the technological capacity, even in Hitler's Germany. You could you could cross the Alps into Switzerland. You can hide in an attic like Anne Frank did. I visited in 1962, East Germany with my father, and met people who had climbed the wall and escaped. So it was possible. Many died doing it, but it was possible. Today, the mechanisms are being put in place that will make it so none of us can run and none of us can hide.

You know, I have a little PTSD from that piece, Jefferey having been Bobby's director of communications when he ran for president. And yet I would just sit there going, his point is so obvious what he is saying. I have no idea what you're talking. Let's go a little lighter here for the last story and talk about, well, avocado oil. So this story has been everywhere and it just came out of nowhere. Here's one of the headlines out of men's fitness. The avocado oil scam. What's actually in the bottle. I could grab a hundred other headlines like this. It's everywhere. In fact, it's all over the news as well. Take a look.

If you're paying extra for foods made with avocado oil because you think it's a healthier option. A new UC Davis study says you may not actually be getting what you're paying for.

Researchers found that 89% of the products tested contain cheaper oils, even though avocado oil was the only oil listed on the label.

89% of chips, mayonnaise salad dressings with avocado oil were fake.

They're blending other oils in avocado oil.

89% contained other, less expensive oils, for example, seed oil.

Looks like they were cut with seed oil, sunflower, safflower, etc..

Which is absolutely insane because people buy these products to avoid seed oils.

We were pretty shocked when we found out a lot of them don't really have avocado oil.

This is a big one. Yeah.

Yeah. This story came from. What's interesting to me is this story came from one study now great that the media is picking up on this, but it's it's rare. I mean, there's a lot of studies that need, obviously, that we cover here. We still can't cover them all on the show. A lot of studies that need press this one for some reason just was everywhere. And let's go to this study by UC Davis. There's researchers out of there and it's called authenticity of avocado and Olive oils uses ingredients, commercially processed foods. They took all types of foods, salad dressing, chips, um, everything basically they could find and what they found. Let's just go to the bottom line here. What they found. 48 out of 54 avocado oil label products were inconsistent with authentic compositional ranges. So there's there's your like 90% there. So a lot of them didn't have what they said in the label according to this research. Now you go into this a little further, breaks it down by group and by product. It says among avocado oil labeled products, 93% of chip samples were classified as inconsistent with authentic avocado oil based on combined fatty acids and sterile criteria. Similarly, 71% of mayonnaise samples and 100% of salad dressing samples were classified as inconsistent. You can see an image from this this study right here. And you can see on the left side, basically they have all these are all the avocado oil products. And on the left there there's only about five dots are consistent with what was on the label. And the rest of them are not consistent.

Now when I look at this study, so this is the exploratory study first of its kind, not peer reviewed, you know. Not that that means a whole lot, as we found out during the pandemic, but it's the first of its kind. You're not having a lot of studies. This doesn't add to a body of evidence, and it's looking at what's in the label. Now, there's also a massive number of companies that aren't reporting what's in their label appropriately. So there's some really big laws around that. So when it comes to like, like chemicals that are in our food that aren't properly safety tested, that's a whole different conversation of what's in the what's on the package compared to what is in the ingredients and what is in the actual food product you're eating. So I find it hard to believe that that many companies are involved in a conspiracy to not label because, you know, they can they can open themselves up to massive class action lawsuits here. That's the bottom line. And the FDA, if they were ever to do anything, could actually shut down their facilities. If they're finding out this is like a big deal. So the question in my mind is, is this a chain of custody thing, uh, where they're getting and sourcing their avocado oil from. Is that something that should be looked at? Um, are the methodologies that these researchers are using did that is that leading to these, these high positives or these false positives? I don't know the answer to that, but there's a lot of questions on this conversation here.

Well, and I think what's so interesting about this, and you're right. And look, if this study is off, I think UC Davis is open to lawsuits because this is affecting buying habits. I also, you know, my red flag goes up when it's a lot of, you know, natural health products that are being called out. And I'm sure there's others that are probably, you know, more big food products that we don't hear about. We hear about the ones that we're saying that they were healthy. And so is this a hit job? You know, I think there's a lot more to come from this story. But let's be clear, we're not saying just those tiny little letters in the back where they said avocado oil, that that wasn't it. This is branded across the top. Avocado oil is being used the way the word organic would be used. And in most circumstances, we're all paying a lot more for the products that say, avocado oil across them. And so if they're making more money by giving us the same crappy ingredients, you're right. That's, that's really egregious. So we'll see where this story goes. But again, I mean, I think a lot of it, a lot of these companies go and sell off to Pepsi or Nabisco and, you know, you watch your holistic product. You really love change overnight. We, you know, there's probably issues of, as you said, maybe the buyers aren't telling you they're changing where they're getting their products from. So a lot here. But, you know, again, this just makes the consumer, we just feel abandoned. Like, how do I, if I'm reading the label, even that doesn't matter. Then what do we do? So I'm glad at least it's getting attention. We need to be on top of these types of things.

Yeah. And it will affect consumer behavior just by the nature of the media. It media gets. So let's let's talk about the FDA in general, though. So Kennedy has finally moved on the grass, the generally recognized as safe designation. That's been an open door that allows companies and corporations to, to self verify. Basically, we have these chemicals we want to put in your food and we promise they're okay. The FDA went great. Put them in. That's why the US has all of these chemicals and the Europe does not have that. So Kennedy is finally closing that loophole. He's starting to pressure companies. He's asking for more data. They need more safety data on this. So that's a big move. And really all eyes on the head of the FDA, Trump's new pick. Now this is breaking news of just yesterday. We have Trump to nominate Heidi Overton to lead the FDA. Um, she did her surgical residency at Johns Hopkins, um, alongside Marty McCrory. So there's an overlap there. She was also at the white House during president's executive order signing with the vaccine order last week. So, um, a lot of a lot of promise here, a lot of eyes on her, a lot of work to do right away. Now also alongside of CDC Director Schwartz. So we have new leadership in the regulatory agencies.

What homeopathy is. It's a vibrational system of medicine that we use to stimulate the body's own innate wisdom. Our medical doctors today, if you, let's say, roll your ankle and it's swelling up, they're going to give you anti-inflammatories. They want to do the opposite to what your body's doing. The homeopath views that inflammation as a good thing. That's a healing response. The human body is a self-healing machine. When it's stimulated correctly, it's incredible what it can do. You see somebody who is injured by a vaccine or comes to me and they like have got full physical pathology and I give you a detox for that and you heal those symptoms immediately. This is confirmation that the original trigger was tied up somewhere in a constituent of the MMR.

Rockefeller had his own private homeopaths. The Queen of England had her own private homeopath. Look at pharma corruption, of course. How much money do they make when people are on lifelong drugs? They don't want people to know about homeopathy and what it can do. Yeah, and I think a lot of the world is starting to realize that now. Like, hey, we've approached this wrong. We can't drug ourselves to wellness. I would give it, I think, at least ten years. And I think homeopathy will be the main stay of medicine. I see us overthrowing the pharmaceutical stronghold. We need to start this revolution. And the groundswell is definitely coming.

Of course I want to, you know, that was on the doctors television show, that clip where I used to work. But I would say I think you just described vaccines.

It's diluted a lot. So we will take from nature all these different substances will get them in the homeopathic pharmacy. Let's say we are making up homeopathic arnica Montana. And when you do that you are diluting it in water and succussing it a lot. And then you're doing that process again. So depending on the potency will depend on how diluted and succussed it is. But when you look into the latest research, even around water, water retaining Information, the potential that water might even hold consciousness. You can see by that process that you could dilute it to the point where all of the frequency and the information resides in that water, but that the toxicity of whatever the original constituent was, is then gone. So we do use some poisons. But as Paracelsus said, you know, whether something is a medicine or a poison is in the dose. Yeah. Yeah.

And these are doses that pharma would never touch so low. I guess that pharma wouldn't even think that. In fact, the argument is there's nothing there. Right. The argument is usually it's just a sugar pill. This is. And I think Paul Offit is making that point. This is just a fraud. It doesn't do anything. But you're saying something that I'm hearing more and more about is right. The frequency, the energy of. And I'll be honest with you, these are words that for me are I struggle with, but I'm seeing so many results around me that I'm realizing. I think we all have to look at this. I'm sort of I need evidence, and yet I take this. So let's let's talk about this arnica because I think that's the one most of us use, right? I have an accident. I ski, I, you know, broke my ribs. Guess what? First thing I did was take some arnica. What is arnica and why is that a homeopathic not considered just an herbal remedy.

Mhm. Well, the fact that it becomes homeopathic is really the dilution and succussion aspect of it, because you're really getting that frequency aspect. Now, when you look at the human body, even leading scientists will tell you now, and the more that we evolve into quantum physics and understanding, you know, we are so much more than we were ever led to believe in homeopathy. We would call it the vital force. This is like your field. To me. It's almost like the human spirit even, because when you think at the moment of conception, sperm reaches the egg, little blast of light, the zinc spark, that is an energetic blueprint, right? That has all of the information, then to go forward and grow this baby perfectly. And we know throughout our life this vital force in Chinese medicine, they will call it Qi. But in all different modalities, we'll call it something else. But that's what we're referring to. It's this divine, innately intelligent force that knows how to heal the human body. It's God given. And so when we are born, you know, and you get a cut or an injury, the body knows what it needs to do. You know, if you roll an ankle, let's say, and you need Arnica Montana, what's the body going to do? It's going to swell up that ankle. It's going to be red inflamed probably sore so that you don't move it. So you don't walk on it. And the reason it swells that's a sign of healing. It's sending all of its healing factors to the ankle. Now you go to the allopathic doctor, get the pharmaceuticals. They're going to give you, you know, steroids, probably anti-inflammatories or something to bring that swelling down. You are impinging your body's innate healing response. People do this all the time. You get a fever, they bring it down. No, the tonsils swell. That's protective. If it goes on too long, the doctors will cut them out. Sort of be like, oh, we don't really need those.

Yeah. But what you're really just doing is taking the fire alarm out of the body. The fire is still ravaging, so you're not getting to the root cause of the issue. Now with Arnica Montana, it's interesting because they have done a study recently. It came out in a Maha email by Peter Gould, and he was looking at all of the systematic retractions of articles showing how homeopathy is effective. There was one of those studies on Arnica Montana. Now they are looking at it under the petri dish. And what they can see there is that the tissue exposed to arnica Montana in the homeopathic frequency versus the control of nothing, the macrophages and the healing properties under the influence of arnica Montana were much enhanced. So this goes out into journals where, you know, medical doctors can see it, download it. And a lot of this research is being retracted on purpose, sometimes five years after the fact, 6000 downloads. And a lot of the people who are writing these articles are medical doctors who also love to use homeopathy in their practice. There was one in there on oncology, you know, and the effects with that. There was a retracted article from the European. European Journal of Pediatrics. And this was showing when you use homeopathy for the first 24 months of life compared to the control, which is just normal mainstream intervention, you need, there was less sickness, less need for any antibiotics. The children actually ended up taller, which was an interesting thing. Now that got a lot of attention and then got retracted recently.

Well, I mean, that is what we see in a world that's controlled by the forces of the world, the funding to these papers all coming, you know, from pharma. So we've got a lot of work to do there. I know that it's one of the things that Jay Bhattacharya is trying to clean up is, you know, the money behind these peer reviewed journals, uh, this, you know, because of a lot of my audience, we focus on vaccines, of course, Covid, vaccine injury, but vaccine injury of children. Um, and I consider autism to be a vaccine injury and a very difficult thing to treat and heal. There are people that are successful, but when I'm out there, the there's two major things that I would say are a commonality. I'll always say, you know, when you talk to someone with autism, they'll say, you meet one child with autism, you met one child with autism. There's so many varying variations of what's going on and what actually works. But the theme I do hear is changing diet, removing casein, which is dairy and gluten, wheat products, huge change there. And then the other one is Homeopathics. And I'm just saying it's totally anecdotal, but it is the most common thing I say. I always say, what has worked for you, especially people that have had a lot of success and Homeopathics are always in there, and they talk about Homeopathics being used to regress them back through their vaccine program or something like that. Do you know anything about this process?

I do so in homeopathic practice. You can do something that's called homeopathic detox, essentially. So if a vaccine has caused an assault on the immune system on the body, then you can feed back that exact frequency so they will actually make it from the vaccine constituents. So let's say DTaP, when they feed that frequency back to the human body, remembering that we have a vital force that is very intelligent and it stores a lot of information. When the body receives that stimulus, it recognizes it, and the body mounts a response. This is the aspect of homeopathy we call like cures, like. So it's the frequency that stimulates that healing response. And the downstream effects of that healing is phenomenal. There's a book by Amy Lansky. She's a PhD, used to work for NASA, and her son was diagnosed with autism. And she details in that book called Impossible Cure Her Journey with Autism and using homeopathy. And her son, you know, lost his diagnosis. But it's absolutely one of those. And it's about stimulating the field of the individual to heal itself. So an example of this, there is a woman who's actually studying in our school of homeopathy. And her son, she believed, was injured by the Dtap vaccine and lost his sight. Um, now in that, you can't always say for sure, you know, what was the causative. But as a homeopath, we always are doing a timeline and we're looking for where is that? Never. Well, since when did you get thrown out of balance? So it appeared to her that it was the Dtap.

And very often the never well, since is a vaccination or a medical intervention, it can be other drugs. So, you know, I had a patient recently that I was overseeing a student and she was never well, since an epidural during birth. She has had migraines weekly since that for eight years, fed back the frequency of the labor meds, which we make this in homeopathic pharmacy when given that her migraines are completely gone. So you know that that never well, since hypothesis was correct. Because if you feed back the frequency and it heals, you know, that's what it was. But in this case, with the D

you're also just there, something I really do believe in. You talk about innate wisdom. And it used to be something medicine understood. Medicine used to teach the doctor, listen to your patient. They know more about themselves than you do. That has been thrown out, burned, destroyed and shelved by all mainstream medicine. But the truth is, is we kind of have a sense where we got off. Right. And I think a lot of people like, I have no idea, but if you really drill down like, well, it might have been and, and so it's interesting, right? We're carrying a knowledge and no doctor is going to ask us that question.

This is why a homeopathic appointment usually takes 90 minutes or more, whereas the average doctor is less than ten minutes. But in homeopathy, I would say there's often three roots of a disease. It could be a toxic medical intervention or environmental. Maybe you're exposed to glyphosate and that's where your body went completely off track. So you can have the toxic exposures, you can have the life events, the trauma. You know, when people's parents divorce. And since then they've had stomach aches or constipation or migraines. That is your never. Well, since it was the emotional trauma.

Absolutely. It is a medicine of the spirit. A lot of people's physical disease is a manifestation of the pain, whether it's suppressed grief, suppressed fear, anger, you know, the body. That's how it speaks to us. The messages come in the form of symptoms. When you go to the allopathic doctor and they just give you the antidepressants, or they give you the steroid cream for the eczema, it doesn't get to the root of why your spirit, why your body is manifesting these symptoms. So the second thing is the mental and emotional trauma. The third would be your generational inheritance. So in the mainstream they're going to call that your genetics, right. Or cancer. It's just in your genetics. No, it's in the energetic. Sometimes though that comes down family lines. So if your mum and your grandmother also had rheumatoid arthritis. There is a chance that when your body starts to express its imbalance, you know throughout life, it is more likely to show up in the ways that familiarly, your energy has been distorted. And homeopathy addresses all three phenomenally.

Wow. So, all right, we've covered like you can deal with vaccine injury, have seen that. And then the real conversation is people that don't want to vaccinate, but like this homeopathic approach to that. Yeah. Um, I'm always on the fence on this. I've always said I want my kids to catch the illness because I believe just like I talked about penguins. I think those penguins are going to be just fine. I think the most robust immunity they can get is from catching bird flu. Glad they're doing it. Glad they're developing immunity and protecting the rest of us. Um, but homeopathics instead, and I want to be clear, we can't use homeopathics yet. The government's not going to recognize it. But but how does it work? How does a homeopathic do what we imagine a vaccine does.

So what's interesting where you said before, you know, it's almost homeopathy sounds like vaccines, right? And when you look at the Nobel Prize winner for one of the first vaccines in diphtheria, his name was Emil someone. And he says his inspiration was actually homeopathy back then for how to develop it. But the idea homeopathically is that we would expose the field of the child to, you know, that energetic stimulation so that when they come into contact with it in the world, their body would recognize it. It would pass them over. So the way that this was founded was by Samuel Hahnemann, who was an MD turned homeopath when he founded homeopathy. But in 1798, scarlet fever was going around rampant. Now he was treating a young girl with belladonna, for she had inflamed swollen fingers and the joints. Now Belladonna is a remedy that to this day we would use for that. And so she was the only one in the house taking the Belladonna, and the scarlet fever passed her over, and the parents said, that's so weird, because she's usually our weakest child. I would have expected her to get hammered by the scarlet fever. And so then Hahnemann's ticking, and he's thinking, wow, maybe we can use this prophylactically. So it's called Homeoprophylaxis. That's its origins. And then in 1801, he published an article called The Treatment and Prevention No, The Cure of Scarlet Fever. And he talks about belladonna. And a lot of the MDS back then started to get belladonna. They had lines, you know, outside their clinics or houses for people wanting that protection from scarlet fever. I like you, and lots of homeopaths are on the fence in regards to which ones do we think perhaps we will use homeoprophylaxis? Is it needed at all? A lot of homeopaths will say, why don't you just wait until they actually manifest something and then, you know, step in.

And having my three boys, that was generally the way that I wanted to go. But I will say, when they turned, you know, five and six and developed the symptoms of what I would assume is whooping cough. And I've spoken to a few people in holistic fields that, you know, their children manifested the same intense symptoms. I do think, you know, if you were a six week old baby, if you were a six month old or young, that it would actually be very rough. So you've got your schedule now, doctor Isaac Goldin is the phenomenal resource that I would recommend anybody who wants to look into Homeoprophylaxis. Now, he's been even to Cuba working with their government through the Finlay Institute. Um, a doctor over there, Doctor Kemper, Hugo, she they rolled out to 2.2 million people homeoprophylaxis for a leptospirosis outbreak. You can see from the graphs the absolute steep decline once the homeopathics were introduced. Now, that was so successful with those 2.2 million people the next year, the Finlay Institute, which this woman, Doctor Kemper, she's responsible. And she created the first meningitis B vaccine. The only reason she got into homeopathic research is because she saw in one area where they were all given the vaccine, it seemed to take phenomenally. She's like, why is it so effective in this region? So she flies out there, she says to the doctors, what are you doing here? And they said, well, we're doing homeoprophylaxis alongside. And then she started to research it and she said, you know, as a scientist and someone employed, you know, to create vaccines, all that they have ever wanted is safe, truly safe, with no adverse reactions, low cost to make it available to everybody and something that doesn't need the cold refrigeration, you know, the supply chain of vaccines and something that doesn't take years and years to produce.

Because when you are talking about a flu vaccine, by the time they have gotten that one out and they've pumped it into people, whatever strain, you know, they think that they're actually immunizing against, that's gone. And through all of her research and being the president at the Finlay Institute there in Cuba, she believes that Homeoprophylaxis is that come to fruition. And when asked about it. Well, why don't we just do that then she said, it really does just come down to profit because after it was so successful for her with leptospirosis the next year, the Cuban government under Fidel Castro said, don't bother making another vaccine. We don't want to buy it. We're doing homeoprophylaxis. They used Homeoprophylaxis for swine flu for 9.8 million people and only had a handful of cases. And in that, the Finlay Institute didn't get the funding, the vaccines was a source of funding. So she said the doctors, you know, on the board of directors pointed at her and said, this is your fault. You know, that we're not getting the funding. So you can see the economical issues. But Homeoprophylaxis really needs that deeper research. And, you know, if the government was to look into it in regards to the safety, because we are not chemically bombarding your body, it's a completely different approach. Field mediated. That's where I believe the future of medicine, I hope, will take us.
